George KC1FZ and Roy KB1CYV are using a 4 element 2-Meter beam with the sides oriented vertical and the top and bottom oriented horizontal with the feed line attached half way up one side for vertical polarization. Joe's W1JOE secret weapon uses the same 4



element 2-Meter beam except that it is rotated 45 degrees from that of **George KC1FZ** and **Roy's KB1CYV** with the feed line attached to one of the side supports.

The FOX Hunt takes place every Saturday between 10 AM and Noon. The Fox transmits on 146.565 MHz for 30 seconds every five minutes. Listen for the Fox Hunters on the Bridgewater REPEATER 147.180 MHz as they coordinate the start of the hunt at 10 AM and let them know if you can hear the Fox in your back yard.

TAUNTON RECOGNITION NIGHT MADE THE ENTERPRISE

Taunton council honors amateur radio operators

TAUNTON — A group of volunteer radio operators of the Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (R.A.C.E.S.) received a commendation from the City Council Tuesday night.

Mayor Ted Strojny presented citations to R.A.C.E.S. members: Ed Meehan of Corcoran Road, Brockton; Bruce Hayden of Locust Street, Raynham; John Coombs of Main Street, Marshfield; Bill Hayden of Washington St., Whitman; Walter Dolson of Auburn St., Whitman; Paul Burbine of Beulah, Whitman; Paul Burbine of Beulah, Whitman; Ken Waine of School Street, Taunton, John Miller (a blind volunteer) of Glebe Street, Taunton. Bob Loring of Brockton and Jim Gilbert of Marshfield were also recognized.

"Volunteer service is being provided by a solid group of communicators during a time of fear about terrorism and winter storms," said Taunton's Emergency Management Director Richard Ferreira.

"Dr. Figlock found R.A.C.E.S. volunteer John Miller who, even though he is blind, can quickly find a number on a ham radio quicker than I," added Ferreira.

R.A.C.E.S. members volunteer their time to provide emergency communications from City Hall's emergency operation center to the reception center at Taunton High School as part of Taunton's preparedness program with the Pilgrim Station nuclear plant.

The radio operators are also part of the communications lifeline from Taunton's emergency operation center to shelters throughout the state.

R.A.C.E.S. volunteers perform monthly communication tests and periodic drills.

The group was founded in 1952 as a public service by a group of ham radio operators to provide a volunteer communications group within government agencies.



TAUNTON EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER

A crew checked out the HF rig at the Taunton Emergency Operations (EOC) center in March. The rig is an ICOM IC-761 with a capability of 10-160 Meters. The antenna was found to be resonate on 6 meters and 12 meters and found to have a good SWR on 10 and 15 Meters. All other bands 20 thru 160 Meters had higher SWRs. This ICOM Rig does not have 6 Meter capability.

GO-KIT POWER SUPPLY



The four club members purchased the emergency battery power supply packs that were located at a bargain price at Ocean State Job Lot to compliment their GO – KITS and provide readily available emergency power for a mobile rig in the house. The emergency power supply has two cigarette lighter sockets along with jumper cables and a small light. It comes with a small 120 Volt AC trickle charger or can be charged from the cigarette lighter socket in your car using a DC power cord that also comes



with the unit. The Powermate contains an 18 Amp/Hour sealed lead acid battery that is designed for starting cars, motorcycles and/or lawn tractors.

<u>UPGRADE:</u> Stu Forman WA1SAF passed the 5 wpm code test and upgraded to General Class in March at the Braintree VE Testing center. Congratulation to **Stu WA1SAF** and thanks for setting an example for others to follow.
