PORTABLE PACKET DEMONSTRATION

Paul Burbine N1VTI brought in his portable PACKET radio station for show and tell at the April meeting along with a custom made, two piece, light weight, aluminum J-Pole antenna that was designed to be supported on a 12 foot collapsible fiberglass pole.

Paul N1VTI is holding the custom made J-Pole antenna and the collapsible pole can be seen on the floor. **Paul N1VTI** used a portable laptop computer that he was powering with a Coleman Powermate 18 amphour battery seen in the yellow container under the table.



The transceiver can be seen on the window shelf strapped to a PACKET Radio TNC and a gell cell battery. The antenna used was a 5/8 vertical that was also sitting on the window shelf. **Paul N1VTI** was able to demonstrate his ability to connect to the WHIT digipeater and then to connect to, and leave a message at, **Bruce's NI1X** PACKET station in Raynham – all from the Whitman Library on battery power and portable equipment.

W1 QSL INCOMING BUREAU

FOR THE NEW HAMS: The W1 QSL Bureau will sort and forward to you any Foreign QSL cards received as a result of your DX contacts along with a statement of your account. Although the W1 Incoming QSL Bureau operates under the guidance of the ARRL, you do not need to be an ARRL Member to use it. The W1 Bureau sells envelopes and postage stamps and requires that you send a check or money order and no longer wants you to send SASE's.

The Whitman Club will send about \$20.00 when requested. The check is made out to **W1 QSL Bureau** and the check is marked with the Club Call Sign **WA1NPO** and sent to the **W1 QSL Bureau Manager**, **Burt Eldridge**, **W1ZS** at **P.O. Box 7388** in **Milford**, **MA 01757-7388**.

<u>OUTGOING BUREAU:</u> To use the Outgoing QSL Bureau you have to be a member of the ARRL and the rate is \$1.00 for 10 cards or less and then \$4.00 per $\frac{1}{2}$ pound. Therefore a contester who sent 1-1/2 pounds of outgoing QSL cards (about 300 cards) would pay 3 x \$4.00 = \$12.00. See the ARRL WEB page for more details at <u>www.arrl.org</u>

The Whitman Club ARRL members can send 110 QSL cards (1/2 pound) to Europe for \$4.00 (direct mailing at \$0.80 each would cost \$88.00). If you were to send 54 QSL cards, at one time, to Europe via the Bureau, instead of direct at \$0.80 each, your membership in ARRL would be paid for. If you send more than 54 QSL cards via the bureau in any one year - you would most likely come out well ahead of the game cost wise. One of the benefits of joining the ARRL.
