

FOX HUNTING - by Roy KB1CYV

The South Shore Fox Hunters are now in their eighth year of Saturday morning hunts for the ever-elusive fox. The boundaries for the fox's den are Rtes. 128, 3, 138 and 44 which gives the fox 350 square miles in which to find a public area in which to hide. The fox will transmit for a minimum of 30 seconds

every 5 minutes on 146.565 MH, with the hunters starting from their favorite locations utilizing various antenna configurations to track down that nasty critter.

Whitey K1VV had contacted Gil W1GMF regarding making a DVD of fox hunting which could be distributed by the ARRL to affiliated clubs seeking information. Gil W1GMF put out a call for hunters to join in this special event, which was held on Saturday, September 27, 2003. A fox box was to be hidden in the general vicinity of the fox, operating on low power on 146.535 MH giving the hunters an opportunity to demonstrate close in RF directional finding.

TAUNTON EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER - VOLUNTEERS UPDATE

The Taunton Amateur radio volunteers were invited by **Rick Ferreira** – Director of the City of Taunton EMA, to attend Community Emergency Response Training (CERT), a 10 week course that is a first responder program that reviews disaster response preparedness with such topics as fire fighting, first aid, and the psychological effects of a disaster. Signing up were **Paul Burbine N1VTI, Ken Waine KB1INN, Jeanne Ridge KB1JZK**, **Doug Cugini N1KQZ** and **Nancy Johnson KB1KDI**.

The team was also invited to participate in an October 8th drill at the Morton Hospital that tested the city response to a scenario where victims were contaminated by a yellow chemical spray from an overhead plane and the Hospital's new decontamination equipment was assembled (a water wash facility) and put through a test run with **Jeanne KB1JZK** as one of the victims. **Doug N1KQZ** reports observers were on the lookout for breaches of security and / or contamination procedures. During a hurricane planning meeting last month, **Bruce NI1X** tested the 2-Meter radio link between the Taunton EOC and the Taunton State Hospital. **Bruce NI1X** talked with **Carl Cooperrider KB1IWU** who works for and set up the 2-Meter capability at the Taunton State Hospital. The HF rig was also tested and six 10-Meter contacts were made by **Bruce NI1X**, **Paul N1VTI** and **John N1ULJ** with local HAMs including one with **Ken Garren Jr. WA1DUZ** in Hanson. A second 2-Meter transceiver and antenna are in the planning / budget stage.
