# PLIMOTH PLANTATION GOES ON THE AIR

That great headline was prominently featured on the second page of the Brockton Enterprise on Wednesday December 10, 2003 and included the attached article on the Plimoth Plantation Special Event

We had a total of 30 members and / or area HAMs who either participated or were able to log in with **WA1NPO** and we have received another 30 QSL card requests from US HAMs to date. We made 8 contacts with England and the closest one to Plymouth England was with **Cyril G3XED** in Bristol England.

In last month's newsletter article, that detailed this years Plimoth Adventure, the names of **Steve Rudin W1WSN** and **Stu Forman W1SAF** were inadvertently left off the list of members who were not able to attend the Special Event but were able to log in with **WA1NPO** via amateur radio.

AMS ON THANKSGIVING: The Whitman Amateur Radio Club set up a base station and portable antennas at Plimoth Plantation the weekend following Thanksgiving, making contact with 177 amateur radio operators in 31 states, 13 foreign countries and three Canadian Provinces, while sharing information about Plimoth Plantation. Visitors were able to learn about how amateur radio operators are able to send messages quickly in response to emergencies. #### **CLUB HISTORY: The Whitman Amateur Radio Club was founded in 1962**

Club member **Robert Burns K1RB** reports that he was the first Whitman Amateur Radio Club President when the Club was founded in 1962, back in the days when the members were trying to recruit amateur radio operators for Civil Defense and originally met at the Fire Station that was the Civil Defense Headquarters. This means the Club has been in existence for 41 years.

One old record documented a pivotal meeting that was held on Jan 28, 1963 to "analyze and discuss the problems confronting the 14 founding members". The foresight and dedication of those original founding members to establish and implement a program to teach amateur radio code and theory classes, starting in 1963, solved most of the problems by making all members active teachers or teacher's assistants, generating new members and generating the corresponding additional new member dues revenue. **Bob K1RB** was one of those original amateur radio theory course teachers. The meetings were later moved to **Ray Hoffses K1UMP** home QTH on Washington Street in Whitman where you walked into a big open cellar with chairs and tables along with a Morse code tape machine and **Ray's K1UMP** HAM shack room that was built in the far corner.

The Whitman Conservation Commission was first approached in November 1963 about the use of the Pine Quonset hut as a Club House. This means that the Whitman Amateur Radio Club members are on their fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) 10 year lease for the use of the Pine Street Quonset Hut.

Documents show that the Whitman Amateur Radio Club was incorporated as a non-profit organization with the State of Massachusetts on December 10, 1965. The Whitman Amateur Radio Club became an ARRL affiliated Club on May 2, 1968 and has been an ARRL affiliated club for 35 years.

The Club annual auction / Flea Market was shifted to, and held at, Saftler's parking lot for the first time in 1976. This means that Saftler's has been supporting the efforts of the Whitman Amateur Radio Club for 27 years.

<u>MUSEUM VISIT</u>: The Bruce NI1X talked with Mark Vess of Hanson and Mark has invited the members of the Whitman Amateur Radio Club to come visit his indoor museum and his outdoor collection of old engines and old tractors. #### RACES VOLUNTEER UPDATE

Rick Ferreira – the Director of the Taunton Emergency Management Agency has been asking that a amateur radio technician class be held in the Taunton area. The purpose is to help **Rick Ferreira** and his assistant **Rick Tucker** become amateur radio operators and to recruit more amateur radio civil emergency service (RACES) volunteer operators for the City of Taunton and surrounding towns.

Carlos Wharton WP4US, the newest amateur radio volunteer for the City of Taunton, offered to teach the class. Rick Ferreira offered to provide the classroom facilities and recruited students from the City of Taunton Emergency Management Agency volunteers and from similar volunteers from the surrounding Towns.

A total of 23 students signed up with 9 from Taunton, 9 from Rehoboth and 1 from Norton at the first class. **The Bruce NI1X** has provided Whitman Club Newsletter handouts on the Marconi Special Event and Field Day 2003 for show and tell.
