RACES VOLUNTEER UPDATE

In March, members of the Whitman and Massasoit Club's volunteered their help to the City of Taunton and the Town of Bridgewater by participating in a drill that involved some aspects of the simulated emergency evacuation of residents in the vicinity of the Plymouth Nuclear Power Plant. The Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES) volunteers provide backup radio communication between the Reception Center, Transportation Staging Area and individual shelters in Bridgewater and Taunton back to the local Emergency Operations Center's (EOC's).

CITY OF TAUNTON - PLYMOUTH NUCLEAR PLANT EVACUATION DRILL

Whitman club members participating in the City of Taunton were **Bruce Hayden NI1X, Bill Hayden N1FRE** and **Ken Waine KB1INN** along with Taunton HAM **John Miller N1UMJ**.

Club member **Ken Waine KB1INN** (shown in front of the photo to the right) is the radio communication officer and **Steve Foster** (shown in rear), a Technician Class Student and now **KB1KZW**, was training as his backup.

Club member **Bruce Hayden NI1X** (shown in the middle of the photo seen below) is the RACES Coordinator and **Bill Hayden N1FRE** (in front) is designated RACES Coordinator 2 and was training as his backup. Area HAM **John Miller N1UMJ** of Taunton (in rear) was participating as a RACES communicator (operator).





The radio room also included three representatives manning the Police Dept., Fire Dept. and Dept. of Public Works radios. The radio room was a full house – earphones would be required in a full emergency. Between the two adjoining rooms of the Emergency Operations Center there were about two dozen people all talking on radios or telephones and all within earshot of each other.

The scenario started about 8:30 am with an ALERT from the Plymouth Nuclear Power Plant that initiated a callout notification plan. The RACES volunteers called up

responded to the City of Taunton Emergency Operations Center and went through their checklist of establishing communication with MEMA Area II headquarters in Bridgewater and performing radio checks with area EOC's such as the Town of Bridgewater and the Town of Plymouth.

As the conditions at the Nuclear Power plant deteriorated in the scenario, a Site Area Emergency was declared and additional RACES volunteers were simulated to be put on alert. As the scenario progressed, the conditions at the Nuclear Power Plant further deteriorated and a General Emergency with simulated evacuation of schools and residents to the south and west of the plant. Additional (simulated) RACES volunteers were instructed to report to host schools in the City of Taunton that are involved in the evacuation plan.

Team players were communicating via telephone and fax while simulated messages were sent via amateur radio to reach people who were in the field and unable to be reached by normal communications. In this scenario the plant was stabilized at about 1:30 pm and the drill terminated at 2 pm. The 2-Meter amateur radio communication system was tested and worked OK.

TOWN OF BRIDGEWATER – PLYMOUTH NUCLEAR PLANT EVACUATION DRILL

The Town of Bridgewater - Plymouth Nuclear Power Plant evacuation plan - is supported by the Massasoit Amateur Radio Club membership. There were three Whitman club members, who are also members of the Massasoit Club, who were participating in the Town of Bridgewater Drill. They were **Roy Logan KB1CYV, George Pedro KE1KR** and **Joe Serrilla W1JOE** who are all part of the core team of Massasoit Club member RACES volunteers helping **Carl Aveni N1FY**, who is the Town of Bridgewater RACES Coordinator and the ARES Emergency Coordinator for this area. **Roy KB1CYV** reported there were four other Massasoit Club members participating in the Town of Bridgewater drill. They were **Gil Follett W1GMF, Bob Mandeville N1EDM, Harry Ketler W1DGD** and **Phil MacNamara N1XTB**.

RACES RADIOGRAM TRAINING

Message training is held on the first Monday of the month at 7:30 PM on the Taunton REPETER 147.135 MHz. In March **Bruce Hayden NI1X, Carlos Wharton WP4US** and **Jim Bardwell KB1KVM** were at the Taunton Emergency Operations Center and copied four RADIOGRAM messages being sent from MEMA Region II Headquarters, that is located at the Bridgewater State Prison bunker, to the local City and Town Emergency Management Directors. Everyone is encouraged to listen in from your home QTH and copy along – good practice.




During one of the March classes **The Bruce NI1X** brought in **Paul's N1VTI** radio Go-Kit, for show and tell, which included a Radio Shack HTX-252 2-Meter mobile transceiver mounted on a Portable Power Supply. The students were very impressed with Paul's ingenuity and workmanship.

As you can see the transceiver is mounted on the power supply along with a bracket to hold the microphone and one of several brackets to hold an antenna. The latest antenna bracket replaces the rubber duck antenna connector and supports a



threaded trunk mount antenna fitting that allows **Paul N1VTI** to attach a 2-Meter 5/8 whip antenna for greater gain. Note the three 18 inch flexible ground radials. **Paul N1VTI** can always attach a mag. mount or external antenna via the coax connector on the back of the radio. The power supply is kept trickle charged by a small plug in power supply. **Paul N1VTI** reports he is ready to sell this unit as he already has plans for a 2-Meter / 440 MHz replacement.
