PILGRIM EVACUATION DRILL - TAUNTON GRADED EXERCISE

The City of Taunton, The Town of Bridgewater and the Town of Braintree took part in a FEMA graded exercise to test the Plymouth evacuation plans for these three host communities. During this exercise - as conditions at the Pilgrim Nuclear Power Plant deteriorated - the precautionary measure of evacuating the Plymouth School children to Braintree, Bridgewater and Taunton were simulated. This was followed by the evacuation of some of the residents in the immediate area around the plant. As an example - the City of Taunton might see 110 school busses and about 10,000 extra people in the city. The Red Cross would plan to set up shelters if people were still housed in the Host schools after 8 p.m. at night. Some of the Mass Care Shelters would be set up in neighboring cities and towns.

The training and equipment in place enables the cities and towns to be ready to respond to any emergency, not necessarily related to the Nuclear Plant, like the Dam Crisis in Taunton. 

The Bruce NI1X and Paul KB1MTW were treated to a private tour of the museum by James Fahey the museum Director. The museum is dedicated to Thomas Watson and military history. The library section is filled with books on Thomas Watson, military history and the history of Braintree.

Thomas Watson was the co-inventor of the telephone with Alexander Graham Bell and became the Head of Research and Development at the National Bell Telephone Company. This made him a wealthy man. We got to hear the story of the famous "Mr. Watson - come here - I need you" the first words spoken over the new telephone transmitter / receiver being developed by Alexander Graham Bell and Thomas Watson. After he resigned from the Bell Telephone Company, Thomas Watson became the founder of what would become the Fore River Shipyard.

TECHNICAL TOPICS - THE 80-METER MOBILE ANTENNA







John WQ1L, Bruce N1XZD & Vic N1OEH

John Coombs WQ1L built a mobile antenna for 80-Meters by winding 67 feet of copper wire around a 7 foot long fiberglass pole and attaching the pole with a universal ball mount to a frame mounted on the cab of his truck. John WQ1L cut a grove in the 7 foot long 3/4 inch fiberglass rod that had five turns per inch and tightly wound the copper antenna wire in the grove. The wire is covered with heat shrink. The antenna wire attaches to a SGC-230 automatic antenna tuner. John WQ1L reports that he has made 80-Meter contacts with New York, Maine and New Hampshire and 40-Meter contacts with New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, North Carolina and Virginia while traveling between Marshfield and Whitman. John WQ1L also reported a 17-Meter contact with Belgium.

Even better – come to the Whitman or Taunton Emergency Operations Center (EOC) where all are invited to join in and copy the three or four RADIOGRAM messages in a classroom setting – no pressure.

MILITARY AMATEUR RADIO SERVICE (MARS) - UPDATE

Phil McNamara N1XTB reports that the MARS group has entered into a memo of understanding with the Transportation Safety Agency (TSA) to set up MARS stations at a half dozen airports around the country. **Phil N1XTB** says – "As I understand it, two, two man teams (12 Hour shifts) per airport with their own HF gear with PACTOR capability would provide WINLINK E-mail support to the TSA in the event of communication / internet outages. Team members would be volunteers from all three MARS branches."

<u>SCUTTLEBUTT:</u> Bill Hayden N1FRE reports that he made a slinky antenna and installed it in his attic, that used two slinkies and has an equivalent length of 132 feet and tunes up on HF just fine. Bill N1FRE also reported that he built an off-center fed 2-Meter / 440 MHz dipole antenna and installed it in his attic at the same time.
