

On Wednesday, September 5, a donation of 15 newly released amateur radio books was presented to Jennifer Inglis, the Whitman Public Library Director. The Whitman Amateur Radio Club meets in the community room of the library on the first Wednesday of each month. The public is always welcome. For 92 years, the FCC has licensed amateur radio operators. Although basically a hobby that explores electronics and communication, operators all over the country are routinely asked to respond as volunteers, to set up and maintain emergency communications during times of disaster. This generally occurs when electricity, cell phone service and normal communications are rendered unusable. The "HAMs" are able to set up totally independent, portable communications to assist

public safety personnel until the regular systems are back on line. In our New England area there are more than 4000 trained Skywarn weather spotters that are able to report in real time, on the ground, severe weather related conditions to the National Weather Service, (NWS), in Taunton, Mass. This information is used by the meteorologists to confirm or augment their Doppler radar system information.


