

Crystal Radio

At the May meeting **Jim Ford NM1F** brought in some of the radio kits that he had made. They included a crystal radio, a regenerative shortwave receiver, a 3 band QRP transmitter, an electronic T/R switch and a 100khz crystal calibrator.

Jim NM1F is shown holding a crystal radio made from design details found in the Crystal Radio Society literature (It Came From The Junkbox By: **Dan Peterson WA6OIL**). The crystal radio article, copies of which were available at the meeting, included complete coil design details. You need to pick up three broadcast band 365pf. variable capacitors. Contact **Jim NM1F** or **Bruce NI1X** for copies of the article if you are interested.


What is special about the design of this crystal radio is an additional circuit - a tunable wavetrap that is sufficient to tune out a loud local station like **Jim NM1F** has in Plymouth. **Jim's NM1F** workmanship is fantastic and it sure looks like he is having fun. **Jim NM1F** reports that he has gotten 5 stations so far.

AMATEUR RADIO EMERGENCY SERVICE

Call to service Saturday May 10, 2008 by: Bill N1FRE

It was late on Saturday afternoon when the call for help came into the Whitman Fire rescue department. It was the unusual event in May of an adult male swimming in the south end of Hobart's pond that prompted the deployment of the rescue personnel to the area. After a couple of hours the incident became a recovery effort and the search then escalated to involve mutual aid from surrounding towns, the County, and even the State police helicopter. A dive team of 8 divers, search and rescue boats from several towns were launched. Special equipment from as far away as Onset was sent to the scene to assist. Some 20 to 30 professional people were on the scene at any given time.

At about 7:30 pm a call came in to Whitman Emergency Management Agency Director **Bob Schmitt KB1MTY**, requesting the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) rehabilitation vehicle (CERT REHAB UNIT) come to the scene to provide rehabilitation to the workers at the site. **Paul Moss KB1MTW** was called to drive the Whitman CERT - mobile to the site where it was set up to distribute cold water, Gator-Aide, and hot coffee to the workers there. The vehicle also provided temporary heat to those wishing to warm up a little before resuming. The search operation was suspended at around midnight, to be resumed on Sunday morning.

Around 8:10 a.m. on Sunday morning **Bill Hayden N1FRE** got a call to go to the site to help **Paul Moss KB1MTW** and Director **Bob Schmitt KB1MTY** continue with the re-hab effort. We continued to pass out water, Gator-Aide, and hot coffee and donuts until the recovery effort concluded around 10:30 am.

It was long before sunrise when I arrived in Hopkinton for the start of the 112th Boston Marathon. The common was dark, but within a half hour (5 AM) It was beginning to come alive. As the sun began to brighten up a cloudy sky all the Start Team amateur radio operators had checked in and were off to locations around Hopkinton. Thirty HAMs in all, each with their own HT's and simplex frequencies.

Earlier this weekend I was given my assignment **Town Common Escort; Dottie Ferriter. Dottie** is the Chair of the Hopkinton Marathon Committee. This is not her first marathon, and it quickly showed. As volunteers began to arrive they each promptly got to work, with very few questions ask. Just getting the volunteers organized seems like a task, handing out jackets, pins and credentials. But every thing went off without a hitch. The information booth and Net Control station were up and running like a well-oiled machine.

Other locations around the commons have volunteers arriving too. The Athlete's Village at the High School, South Street and the State Park each


responses once the onset of symptoms is present. **Tedy** was very nice to everyone who came by, stopping for picture and autographs.

The amateur radio operators in the local area City and Town Emergency Operations Centers copied four messages from MEMA Region II headquarters as part of the RACES portion of the Cape Cod Emergency Traffic Plan Exercise. During this scenario, a Hurricane named Conan made landfall on Cape Cod and forced the evacuation of thousands of people. The military base on the Cape would be used as a shelter and mutual aid would be requested and sent from the various communities.
