WHITMAN AMATEUR RADIO PUBLIC SERVICE NET (WARPSN)

The **WARPSN Net** meets every Sunday morning at 8:30 a.m. on the Whitman REPEATER 147.225 MHz PL 67. Come join in and share your amateur radio related activities with the other area HAMs and short-wave listeners as well.

As part of our training, we encourage everyone to practice sending routine RADIOGRAM messages. In May we had 4 sessions with an average of 12 area HAMs checking in each week and 9 messages were sent.

John Murphy KB1PHN was Net Control for the Sunday morning May 25th WARPSN NET and operated from the Flea Market using Walter's K1BZD 2 - Meter transceiver as a Club Station and using the club's Diamond 2-Meter / 440 MHz / 6-Meter vertical antenna.

Bill Hayden N1FRE volunteered to set up his ICOM IC-756 transceiver and connected it to his portable BUDDIPOLE dipole antenna. The BUDDIPOLE dipole antenna was set for 20-Meters and mounted on a 20 ft pipe mast that was lashed to the railing. The antenna could be rotated by hand.

Paul Burbine N1VTI volunteered to set up his new 2-Meter Go-Kit and is seen monitoring the Bridgewater REPEATER for checkins. Paul N1VTI reports that he plans to build a 6-Meter dipole antenna for Field day.



FIELD DAY 2008 - RIDE THE WAVES

The Whitman Amateur Radio Club will participate in a National Emergency Preparedness Exercise, called Field Day 2008, over the weekend of June 28th and 29th.

The object of the exercise is to see how many other amateur radio stations can be contacted in a given 24 hour period that starts at 2 p.m. (EDT) on Saturday afternoon and ends at 2 p.m. on Sunday afternoon.



We need your help to set up tents and equipment and to take a shift operating the Club Station. The Technician Class operators can operate HF under the control of a higher class Control Operator. Come on down and have some fun. A crew will be staying overnight.

Field Day Directions

The WARC will be holding Field Day 2008 on June 28 and 29 in a new location this year on the Old Colony YMCA property in East Bridgewater, MA. Set up will be Saturday morning at 9:00 a.m.

- 1. If coming from State Route 18, [North or South], connect and follow State Route 106 East, in East Bridgewater, [sign says toward Halifax] for 1.2 miles, the YMCA property will be on the right across from a small strip mall containing a Dunkin Donut, convenience store and pizza shop.
- 2. If coming West on State Route 106 [from Halifax], YMCA property will be on the left across from a small strip mall containing a Dunkin Donut, convenience store and pizza shop.
- 3. For "BOTH" Field Day entrance -- as you enter the "Y" parking lot-- with the main building on your right, drive onto the field through the double gate in the chain link fence directly ahead. The WARC Field Day site is located straight ahead, bearing slightly to the left in the back. The site is not visible from the parking lot.
- 4. If you should become confused, or need direction, "talk-in" will be on the 147.225 REPEATER (PL 67). Someone will help you from there. You should have no problem accessing the Whitman REPEATER in it's new location. It is hard to see in the photo but the REPEATER antenna is now located on the top of a commercial tower in the southeast corner of Whitman.
- 5. 73's & hope to see you at Field Day this year.
