

consists of an Icom IC-2720 2-Meter / 440 MHz transceiver that he used along with **Phil's N1XTB** battery and solar panels and a copper cactus 2-Meter portable antenna. The radio team volunteers were positioned all around the racecourse and communicated on 146.565 MHz simplex. There were no incidents to report.

A closer look at **Carl's N1FY** new Go-Kit (radios in a box) found, along with the 2-Meter / 440 MHz transceiver, an ICOM IC-706 HF transceiver with an LDG Z-100 autotuner, an Astron power supply with an Anderson power pole fused strip and a KAM XL Packet Terminal Node Controller (TNC).









The temperature started out in the 50's and wound up in the 60's – a beautiful day. The race started with a 14.5-mile bike race, followed by a 1.7 mile kayak / canoe leg and then followed by a 10K (6-mile) road race. There were 45 teams with some people competing in all three events. 




# NEW ENGLAND AMATEUR RADIO FESTIVAL - NEAR-Fest - IV By: The Bruce" NI1X




