



NEW MEMBER: Robert "Q" Callahan W1QWT lives in Scituate with his wife Jean, holds an Extra Class license, and has been licensed for about 38 years.

Bob W1QWT reports: "Nickname is Q. I am a new product design engineer (embedded software, hardware) for Electroswitch Corp. in Weymouth.

My main HF radio is a Kenwood TS690S and I have a Yaesu FT897 that is used portable and for digital modes. Above my head is an Ameritron 811 HF amplifier.

My FM radio is a FT 8900 and I have two scanners. Top shelf is a Heathkit DX 60 and a Heathkit Apache 80 thru 10-Meter transmitter that I use for AM. Below the Heathkit on the shelf is a National NC300 receiver. The black units in the rack cabinet is a Navy TSC12 set like the one I used when I was a radioman in the Navy. On the other side by the microphone boom is a Hammarlund HQ-110 AC receiver. Also shown is a Clegg 99'er 6-Meter AM transceiver. The walkie-talkie is a 900-MHz unit.

The antenna patch panel patches any one of my antennas to any one of my radios. I have for antennas a 75-Meter dipole fed with open wire line and a balanced tuner. I have an Alpha Delta 160 thru 20-Meter sloper, a 60-Meter wire antenna, a 20-Meter dipole inside the attic; a 70-cm yagi, 2-Meter yagi, and a 6-Meter yagi all horizontal and rotateable. I have a Diamond 6-Meter, 2-Meter, and 70-cm, vertical for FM work. I have a scanner antenna at 40 feet on my 65 foot tower.

Last but not least - in the garage is the Scituate 2-Meter REPEATER (145.390 MHz) with IRLP and echo link.

Paul Moss KB1MTW volunteered to be the Fox and was hiding on conservation land in a parking lot behind some buildings off Pleasant Street in Hanson - right near the railroad tracks. The first reports were that some of the Fox Hunters could hear **Paul KB1MTW** with a paper clip antenna from Rt. 27 in the south end of Hanson. After traveling past the Fox's den and then doubling back, the first in was **Roy KB1CYV** in 25 minutes.

Paul KB1MTW was transmitting on 146.565 MHz for one minute every 5 minutes and reported that he was transmitting at 5 watts. All you need is a handheld receiver with an S-Meter and a variety of smaller and smaller paperclip antennas. The S-Meter signal gets stronger and stronger the closer you get to the Fox's den. A directional beam antenna with an attenuator works even better. Note the home made tape measure beam antennas.

The next Fox Hunt is scheduled for Saturday, December 6, 2008 between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. **Roy KB1CYV** has volunteered to be the Fox and will be hiding in Hanson.
