





Jim Havens W1GQN reports: “When I got serious about re-entering the world of CW I found I was not fast enough to use my Vibroplex Bug. The counter weight that controls the speed of dit repetition will only drop down to 15 – 20 WPM. When trying to send at 7 – 10 WPM the character formation does not sound right. At the present time I can copy about 7 WPM solid and only 10 WPM if pressed. My J-38 straight key was a poor \$15.00 knock-off and was very hard to use.

I decided to do a Google search for keys and found a web site www.americanmorse.com that offered a straight key in kit form for \$35.00. It took me about ½ hour to assemble and required a Phillips head screwdriver, an Allen wrench, and a file. I was pleasantly surprised by the smooth operation of the key. I have made several contacts with this key already and the more I use it the more I like it.

As it turns out **Doug Hauff W6AME** makes these kits as well as others in his machine shop, which explains the highly machined components”.



Bridgewater REPEATER gets IRLP and EchoLink upgrade

Phil McNamara N1XTB reports that a dual EchoLink / IRLP – (Internet Radio Linking Project) connection to the Bridgewater REPEATER has been installed. **Steve Meuse N1JFU** configured a Linux computer (CentOS) with the IRLP card and installed the EchoIRLP software. Working with **Jeff Lehmann N1ZZN**, a link radio has been installed at the Bridgewater repeater site to connect with the new EchoIRLP server at **Phil's N1XTB** QTH.

The antenna party was held on Sunday, April 5, 2009. **Steve N1JFU** provided a higher gain 70 cm antenna for the link that **Phil N1XTB** installed with a few trips up to the roof. Some testing was done by **Steve N1JFU** and **Jeff N1ZZN** with the new antenna but more work is expected.

Phil N1XTB also reports that a modified power point presentation originally authored by **Rob Macedo KD1CY** was shown by he and **Carl Aveni N1FY** to some local town officials. The presentation gave an overview of the emergency communication resources available in the Commonwealth. Most of the material described the contributions of licensed Amateur Radio volunteers to their local Emergency Management Agency through the RACES program, The functions of SKYWARN, MARS, and ARES assistance to agencies including the Red Cross and Salvation Army were also presented.

MEMA is also rebuilding their statewide VHF system. Every town in the Commonwealth was provided at least one radio to operate a couple of years ago. During the first week in April, MEMA Region 2 communities had an opportunity to visit Region II MEMA headquarters in Bridgewater and have their radios reprogrammed.

There is an ARES Net held following the RADIOGRAM training on the first Monday of the Month on the Minuteman Linked REPEATERS. Heard checking in to the April ARES Net at 8:30 p.m. were **Ray Bolduc KB1ODU**, **Bruce Hayden N1IX**, **Phil McNamara N1NTB**, **Jeff Lehmann N1ZZN** and **Jeremy Breef-Pilz KB1REQ**.
