The Fox transmits on 146.535 MHz simplex for one minute every 5 minutes. All you need is a receiver with a S-Meter and smaller and smaller paper clip antennas to attenuate the signal the closer and closer you get to the Fox's den. A 2-Meter beam antenna with an attenuator is best. The next Fox Hunt is going to be Saturday, May 16 at 10:00 a.m. in one of the Bridgewater Towns.

THE 113TH RUNNING OF THE BOSTON MARATHON -- April 20, 2009

As you can imagine - the Boston Marathon is a huge event to coordinate with 26,000 runners and 500,000 spectators involved. Amateur Radio plays an important part by establishing a Net Control Station and positioning amateur Radio Operators throughout the entire 26.2 mile course.

Steve Schwarm W3EVE reports that 250 amateur radio operators were participating with amateur radio operators assigned to the start in Hopkinton, each First Aid station and Water Station along the route and at the finish in Boston. Other HAMs were on standby -

monitoring the Marathon communication and public service channels from MEMA headquarters in Framingham and The ARES Command Center in Bridgewater.

Pi Pugh K1RV reports that this was the 14th consecutive year that he has volunteered his support for the Boston Marathon and was assigned as Team Leader at the Athlete's Field in Hopkinton, MA. and operated a NET Control Station within the Athletic Village.

Bob "Q" Calahan W1QWT reports: This was my second year and I was assigned to the Athlete's Village with Pi K1RV. My job was to be with Peter Bundy **SWL** the "voice of the marathon". He was the announcer and made announcements over the sound system such as when runners Bill W1WRA with certain bib numbers should head out to their corrals. Most people asked that announcements be made asking their friends to meet them in front of the large Poland Spring water bottle. I received special announcements from the

wicked foggy early and wicked cold but it was fun.

Jim Tynan KC1JET Reports: "This was my first year and I was assigned to the Athlete's Village Command Post with Pi K1RV. My specific assignment was at the Medical Tent with the Doctor, Nurse and Physical Therapist from the Newton Wellesley Hospital who were tending to the runner medical needs. I was there to communicate back to the Command Post the needs of the medical staff and reports of injuries etc. So I was only a small part of the whole picture".

The weather was cool and the runners were looking for plastic bags to use as windbreakers before the start of the race. As is the practice - the sweat shirts and warm up pants left at the start of the race were to be collected and recycled.

Carl N1FY had a computer set up and running a program called ProScan that looks like a Uniden Bearcat scanner and is loaded with Public Safety, Police, State Police, Logan and Fire frequencies and distributed over the internet.

EchoLink - New England Gateway conference linked **Rob KD1CY** at the marathon Net Control location with **Carl N1FY** at the Bridgewater ARES Command Center and **Tom Kinahan N1CPE** at the Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) Emergency Operations Center (EOC) in Framingham. They were also monitoring the Web EOC Monitor — The staff at the MEMA Headquarters in Framingham administers and posts messages from local EOCs on the Web EOC - a bulletin board that is available to local Emergency Operations Centers. Telephone was also an option being used.

Most of the radio traffic heard was the amateur radio operations who were collecting information about the number of runners requiring bus pickup at the various first aid stations along the route. **Carl N1FY** says there were no major incidents to report this year.

PLYMOUTH NUCLEAR POWER PLANT EVACUATION TRAINING

About 50 Taunton Emergency Management Agency volunteers participated in a training session on Radiological Emergency Awareness & Response that focused on Dosimeter use & Exposure Control. There were three Whitman Club members participating, **Bruce Hayden NI1X**, **Tony Pinheiro KB1QIN** and **Neal Harrington KB1LXL**, along with at least six other area HAMs – **Rick Ferreira KB1KWF** – TEMA Director, **Rudy Burer KB1LXI** TEMA Asst. Director, **Richard Sproul KB1MBW**, **Steve Foster KB1KZW**, **Barbara Foster KB1KZX** and **Carlos Wharton WP4US**.

One part of the "Evacuation Plan" requires that there will be backup amateur radio communication between the Emergency Operations Center in the Host Communities of Taunton, Bridgewater and Braintree and the designated Reception Centers, the designated Transportation Staging Areas and the designated Host Schools. FIRST MONDAY OF THE MONTH RADIOGRAM TRAINING

Four messages were sent from the Mass. Emergency Management Agency Region II Headquarters in Bridgewater to the local city and town Emergency Managent Agency Directors. Taking the messages in Whitman were **Bill Hayden N1FRE**, **Mike Supple KB10EP**, **Jeff Tracy N1SOM** and **Paul Moss KB1MTW**. Taking the messages for Carver & Bridgewater was **Phil McNamara N1XTB**. Participating from home was **Jeremy Bref-Pilz KB1REQ**.

Paul Moss KB1MTW reported that he took out the Whitman REHAB vehicle to a brush fire in Hanover on Saturday, April 18th with Kevin Dykes KB1MOC and several other CERT participants.


