



Rob KD1CY gave the presentation and along with the power point presentation were spectacular storm photos taken by SKYWARN Observers all across New England .





MASSACHUSETTS STATEWIDE HURRICANE DRILL - JUNE 1, 2009

The Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency Region II headquarters in Bridgewater was coordinating messages going to and from the local city and town Emergency Operations Centers as part of the 2009 "Hurricane Madison" Massachusetts Statewide Hurricane Drill. This Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) / Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Services (RACES) / SKYWARN Drill was held on June 1, 2009. Damage assessments from the local cities and towns were being gathered along with mutual aid and state resourses requests.

National Weather Service Taunton was operating SKYWARN Nets with SKYWARN Observers invited to participate from home and mobile. Other groups invited to participate along with ARES / RACES / SKYWARN volunteers were the Military Amateur Radio Service (MARS), the Salvation Army Team Emergency Response Network (SATERN), The ARRL Headquarters in Newington, Connecticut, the National Hurricane Center in Miami, Florida. Damage assessment information was being gathered and forwarded to MEMA Headquarters and the Nartional Hurricane Center in Miami, Florida.

Along with the 2-Meter transceivers, the exercise included a test of all means of communication such as EchoLink, Web-EOC and the special State VHF transceiver. The goal was to get the messages through to neighboring Emergency Operations Centers, the Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency Region II Bunker in Bridgewater and the Commonwealth State control bunker in Framingham. Finding equipment that does not work is an important part of the test. We learned from past drills that when the traffic gets heavy - earphones are a must. With several 2-Meter transmitters in operation, on different frequencies, at the same time – intermod can be a problem.

Helping **Carl Aveni N1FY** at the Bridgewater Emergency Operations Center (EOC) was **Roy Logan KB1CYV** and area HAM **Andy Niles KB1RSR. Carl N1FY** is the Town of Bridgewater Radio Officer and ARES Eastern Massachusetts Assistant Section Emergency Coordinator. The Bridgewater EOC also serves as the ARES Eastern Massachusetts Command Center and **Mike Neilson W1MPN** the ARRL Eastern Massachusetts Section Manager was also helping out.

WHITMAN EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER

Bill Hayden N1FRE reports that the Town of Whitman had 14 participants taking part in the Massachusetts Region II Hurricane Drill entitled "Hurricane Madison". The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) volunteers were under the direction of **Bob Schmitt KB1MTY**, the Whitman Emergency Management Agency (WEMA) Director. The WEMA communications center was manned by **Bill Hayden N1FRE**, Whitman RACES Radio Officer and trained HAM radio operators **Mike Supple KB10EP**, and **Jeff Tracy N1SOM**. CERT members **Janine Eaton** and **Debbie Cullity** assisted at the EOC, tracking the storm and handing messages from Director **Schmitt KB1MTY** to the radio operators to be relayed back to MEMA Region II headquarters in Bridgewater.

All CERT members dispatched through out town were issued two-way radios operating on the assigned WEMA UHF frequency. **Kevin Dykes KB1MOC** and **Nick Means** were dispatched to the primary shelter, the Whitman Hanson Regional High School. CERT members **Stu** and **Elizabeth Winston** were dispatched to the other shelter, the Whitman Middle school located on the West side of town. **Paul Moss KB1MTW** and **Leon Beeloo** were sent to the MBTA railroad station at the South Ave. crossing to report conditions in that area of town. **Mat O'Malley KB1MTZ** and **Ted Petersen** drove the CERT REHAB unit to various parts of town to report on conditions.

Local public safety officials indicated that the drill was well organized and proved to be a valuable training tool for their staffs. **Bob Mims WA10EZ**, Region II net control, said "The level of communication and participation in Region II was excellent. The operators in the local communities are to be commended for their professional behavior and communications skills."
