

I think the NTS guys will be impressed, and I had one of the biggest signals before. Oh, and the RFI on 40 with my computer speakers is gone too. That was my first hint something was failing, that's been a very reliable sign for me over the years with that antenna.

Anyway, thanks, hopefully this will all work for a while and I won't have to worry about it for a long time"



As time and weather permits, I try to operate portable from Smith's Cove just outside Digby, Nova Scotia on the Bay of Fundy. This year, like last year, the weather conspired against me and was I not able to operate my portable station. Each day, except Friday my travel day, the temperature climbed into high 80's and lower 90's with dew points exceeding 70 degrees. Even along the Bay of Fundy, after 20 minutes in the sun, you were roasted. Yes, I got a bad sunburn! With Hurricane Bill approaching, I realized by Sunday, August 23rd that I might have to cut my vacation short and not travel to Cape Breton as originally planned. Early on Sunday

Had a Heath DX-100 transmitter and a Hammarlund HQ-170 Receiver with a center loaded whip out the 3rd floor window in the barracks and complete Collins station, KW-1 AM/CW KW, KWS-1 KW transmitter with 75A4 receiver, and 2 KWM-2A's with 30L1 desktop amps at 1KW PEP to a 13 element Log Periodic at 110 feet, a 3 wire Rhombic with 270 feet on a leg at 100 feet thru a Johnson Matchbox KW tuner, 600 ohm open wire feed, and call sign KL7AIR...FUN

In the November 1962 ARRL Sweepstakes Contest, I won first place in the Alaska Section, as KL7AIR. This was a 2-weekend event then and I only operated the first weekend as the Cuban Crisis occurred just before the second weekend and we were all on high alert and the station was only for MARS traffic. #### FOX HUNTING PRESENTATION

# By: Bruce Hayden NI1X and Roy Logan KB1CYV

**Bruce Hayden NI1X** and **Roy Logan KB1CYV** accepted an invitation to give a presentation on Fox Hunting at the Genesis Club meeting in August. The presentation focused on the talking points listed below and went into detail on what techniques were used to find the source of interference on the Plymouth REPEATER in July.

- **1. MONITOR THE FOX FREQUENCY**: At the start of the Fox Hunt even if you can not participate set your handheld or your mobile rig to 146.535 MHz and see if you can hear the Fox. Let the South Shore Fox Hunters know on the Whitman REPEATER 147.225 MHz PL 67 if you can hear the Fox or not. This is valuable information. You never know when the Fox will be hiding in your back yard.
- <u>2. HANDHELD BODY FADING</u>: Some people can body fade. When they place their body between the Fox and their handheld they can see a slight dip in the S-Meter reading. The S-Meter is a series of small black square LEDs that light up on the panel of newer radios and range from one to nine LEDs depending on signal strength. Others have tried placing some kind of metal shield behind their handheld rubber duck antenna to make it directional.

#### 3. BEAM ANTENNA:

- A. Some HAMs use a commercial 4 element 2-Meter YAGI Beam.
- **B.** Many area HAMs have made the 3-element Tape Measure Beam See details below.
- **C. John Coombs WQ1L** designed a 2-element 2-Meter quad beam antenna that can be expanded to a 3-element 2-Meter Quad.
- **D.** Others have made a similar 4-element 2-Meter quad antenna using PVC pipe and fittings.
- <u>4. ATTENUATOR</u>: I have a commercial in line attenuator that allows me to add attenuation in increments of 1dB, 2dB, 3dB, 5dB, 10dB, 20dB, 20dB, 20dB and 20Db for a total of 101dB. There are also single value 20dB in line attenuators available.
- <u>5. PAPER CLIP ANTENNA:</u> Smaller and smaller paper clip antennas make a good attenuator. When you can read the Fox's signal at S-9 with no antenna stop the car you are within walking distance of the Fox. Pick up a connector that fits your HT that has a hole in it that will take a folded up paper clip. (SMA to PL-239 or BNC to PL-239). A safety pin will work just as well.

# **FOX HUNTING PRESENTATION Cont:**

- <u>6. SEARCHER:</u> There are several commercial directional-finding kits available. One is the "SEARCHER" purchased from <a href="www.rainbowkits.com">www.rainbowkits.com</a> and modified.
- **7. MAPS and TRIANGULATION**: A good map is very helpful. Using a compass and protractor, you can plot a line from your location in the direction of the Fox's signal. Travel to a second location and take another reading. Now plot the second line from the new location and where the two lines cross (triangulation) should be the location of the Fox's Den.
- **8. DON'T BELIEVE ANYTHING THE FOX SAYS:** Trust your equipment. Ignore the sounds of the train whistle in the background or the reports of shopping carts being blown across the parking lot and crashing into parked cars or that the Fox is located near a large body of water.
