It has 18 tubes and a separate power supply. This radio cost the Navy \$2800 in 1940 !!. I had to get help lifting it".

TECHNICAL TOPICS - HOMEBREW COAXIAL DIPOLE -

I built the Homebrew 2-Meter Coaxial Dipole that was detailed in the July 2009 issue of QST magazine.

The basic parts included a stainless steel whip, a section of 3/4 inch copper pipe and end cap, a length of threaded lamp tubing with 3/8 inch nuts, some 1-1/4 inch PVC pipe with end fittings and one PL-259 coax fitting.


The coax feed line is fed through the PVC mounting pipe and this keeps the connection out of the weather.

The author of the article described putting the entire antenna inside a 2 inch section of soil pipe and calling the stealth antenna a vent pipe at the mobile home park where he lives and where antennas are not permitted.






