

TOUR OF WTAG RADIO STATION - OPEN HOUSE Jan 16, 2010

Gary Cumiskey W1GRC, Jeremy Breef-Pilz KB1REQ and Jeff Lehmann N1ZZN attended the open house held at radio station WTAG – (580 AM on your dial) in Worchester on January 16, 2010.

Jeremy KB1REQ reports: "I attended the WTAG open-house with my Father and both of us had a great time. It was interesting to track the history of radio technology and production. Much of the old transmitting equipment was preserved, including microphones, recording machines, and tubes, some that emitted so much heat that after being used at the station, they were sold into use as industrial heating coils. Similar to all radio components the current solid-state equipment is much smaller, about the size of a refrigerator, cool to the touch and draws common 220-volts AC. The room was full of photographs and other

records documenting the vibrant history of the station, from it's beginning, licensed to a local department store, to the present. Photos showed the changes in the transmitting site along with the studios and personalities. Meticulous records noted day to day maintenance to the equipment and grounds. The station along with the commentary from radio and television broadcast engineers, made it an excellent experience.

Jeff N1ZZN reports: I guess all I would add, is that **WTAG** is a 5 kW directional station, utilizing 3 towers for their daytime directional pattern and one additional tower at night. **WTAG's** directional pattern is necessary to protect other nearby stations including stations on the adjacent 590 AM in both Boston and Albany, NY. Their current transmitter is a solid state Harris DAX, which is capable of broadcasting an HD Radio signal, which they use during the day.

Ed Caron KA1RSY gave a presentation on the National Incident Management System (NIMS) and the Incident Command System (ICS) explaining the major activities are Command, Operations, Planning, Logistics and Financial / Administrative. During a large scale emergency HAMs are assigned to the Logistics section and could be assigned to assist in areas like local shelters, hospitals and bus staging areas for hospital transportation. In some cases the HAMs are working for the Red Cross with their shelter operation.

LOCAL INVOLVEMENT: Many HAMs in this area are currently signed up and working for the Emergency Management Agency Director at the local Emergency Operations Centers or at one of the designated local shelters in their cities or towns. HAMs in public service are required to be registered by their local served agencies and are required to take on-line ICS training courses. The Plymouth Nuclear Power Plant Evacuation Plan involving the surrounding cities and towns is a good example of local emergency planning involving amateur radio as backup emergency communication.

SKYWARN is the National Weather Service (NWS) volunteer weather spotter program which provides timely severe weather reporting to NWS for the protection of life and property. SKYWARN is an ARES function at NWS Taunton. Involvement with the SKYWARN program and providing communication for local road races and parades allows us to practice Directed Net Control operations under real time conditions. If an emergency happens – your prior participation in training will pay off. Check on the needs of your family first and shelter in place if appropriate. Check in to the ARES Net and respond when requested. Remember we do not self deploy, we are not first responders and we are not in charge. We are available to provide backup emergency communication when all else fails or when normal communication lines are overloaded.

A Bright and Sunny SKYWARN Recognition Day

Snapshot: WX1BOX Taunton, MA

Among the SRD stations representing the Northeast was WX1BOX at the NWS Forecast Office at Taunton, Massachusetts. The '09 event "was very successful and coincided with the twice-per-year SKYWARN Coordinators meeting," according to Rob Macedo, KD1CY, who is ARES SKYWARN Coordinator for NWS in Taunton, Eastern Massachusetts ARES Section Emergency Coordinator, and director of operations for the VoIP Hurricane Net.

Fifteen radio amateurs teamed up for the WX1BOX effort. A total of 309 QSOs were logged, "with 271 unique contacts

made to 41 different NWS Forecast offices, earning the operation the 'Nor'easter Certificate,'" KD1CY said. "These numbers were slightly lower than 2008, but we did not have our SKYWARN Coordinators meeting during SRD last year like we did this year, and this likely led to a lower count of stations.

"We had a Ten-Tec Orion HF rig brought into the weather office for SRD operations through the efforts of Bill Boyes, KB1G, and this radio was used in lieu of the Alinco DX-70TH radio that is installed at the weather office," Rob added.

Radio amateurs in the NWS Taunton Warning Area "are responsible for over 90 percent of the damage reports received and half to two-thirds of the rainfall and snowfall reports received into the weather forecast office.

"We have a very active group that handles SKYWARN Activations from the NWS Forecast Office working with nets and net control stations that handle approximately two dozen nets across four states," he said. "We also use Echolink/IRLP through the New England reflector system 'NEW-ENG' conference system node 9123/IRLP reflector 9123."

According to KD1CY, "band conditions on HF were a bit weaker than 2008, but we still managed a several-hour pile-up on HF on 20 meters that was managed by 15-year-old Jeremy Breef-Pilz, KB1REQ.

"Jeremy has participated in several SKYWARN Activations, including two activations for tornadoes in our County Warning Area over the summer. We also had a number of contacts via EchoLink/IRLP on the 'WX_TALK' EchoLink conference Node: 7203/IRLP 9219 system, and the New England Reflector system."

WX1BOX "also managed (EchoLink) net control for WX4NHC . . . and fielded check-ins for two hours," KD1CY said
