STAND-BY MODE -- FEBRUARY 27, 2010 By: Bruce NI1X

There was a SKYWARN activation with operators at NWS Taunton on Friday, February 26th. Numerous reports of downed trees and power lines, power outages, and significant damage across Northeast Massachusetts into New Hampshire were received. The SKYWARN Observers were monitoring for wind damage and coastal flooding. Wind speeds were reported to have reached hurricane force.

Due to the significant damage that had been reported, portions of Eastern Massachusetts ARES including ESSEX, MIDDLESEX, and SUFFOLK counties were put in stand-by mode starting at 12 AM EST Friday in the event that support was requested by our served agencies.

North Shore ARES was activated on Saturday, February 27th to support Red Cross for Shelter staffing and damage assessments in the Plum Island and Newburyport area. **Jim Palmer KB1KQW** - the ARES Eastern Mass. Assistant Emergency Coordinator (north side operations) along with **Andy Kulhavy KB1PGF**, **Charlie Rocheleau W1CPR** and **Bruce Pigott KC1US** were deployed to the Newburyport Red Cross Shelter to meet needs for the first 24 hours and to determine if relief support was needed.

This storm resulted in individual "big" trees being knocking down and branches broken off that took down power lines and individual poles that could be put back up in a short time. Not like the ice storm of last year that took down rows and rows of trees, poles and wires and took weeks to replace.

ARES members in Southeastern Mass. were requested to provide their name and schedule of availability to **Phil McNamara N1XTB** or **Carl Aveni N1FY**. **Carl Aveni N1FY** reported that **Paul Moss KB1MTW** and **Jim Tynan KC1JET** of the Whitman Club were among the 84 ARES members who reported their availability for deployment but were not called upon this time.

What is ARES Stand-By mode? By: Jim Palmer - KB1KQW


"ARES stand-by mode is to alert Amateurs within ARES that a mobilization is possible on a wide-scale and that some localized mobilizations are or could be taking place in isolated areas. It means to take a look at your Go-Kit and have batteries and equipment ready to go and charged up and take care of any requirements at home in case a mobilization is required and you can participate. Do NOT self-deploy. Wait for guidance from leadership for any deployment. It is an honor to be ready even if you don't deploy for the event. Hopefully, it will be just another exercise of our preparedness and capabilities. If not, the ARES leadership will be forming deployment teams and looks forward to working with you for any wide scale mobilization following the initial impact of a major storm to the region".

TRACKING PROGRESS OF A SAILING TRIP

Jim O'Rourke WG1L reports: "Russ Landrigan N1PFQ/MM, a South Weymouth resident, left from the South Shore Yacht Club last August in his 33 ft. sail boat the "Luturna II". He had a couple of guys with him, one from Weymouth and the other from England. They sailed to the Azores where both of his helpers left for home while Russ N1PFQ/MM waited for his wife Laura to join him.

When she got there the two of them toured a few of the Islands in the Azores and then moved on to Madeira, the Canaries and Gambia, Africa. The next leg of the trip was from Gambia to Trinidad & Tobago in the Caribbean, a 21 day crossing, all the while **Jim KB1ETW**, **Don KA1PJX** and **I**, **WG1L**, would contact them via 20 meters on a daily basis while they were at sea. When they are in port we only call on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. At some of the island stops near Africa

the contacts were not always good as big hills or mountains on the islands seemed to block the signals. They are now going slow and enjoying leisure stops in the Caribbean. They will not return to Weymouth for about a year.

FOX HUNT -- SATURDAY, March 6, 2010 By: The Bruce" NI1X

The weather was beautiful with the temperature reaching 55 degrees on Saturday, March 6, 2010, a great day for a Fox Hunt. The Fox was to hide within a 10 mile radius of the Weston REPEATER. The Fox was given permission to operate on the Weston REPEATER input and therefore could be heard on the REPEATER output. The Fox was to use enough power to pick up the REPEATER.

The South Shore Fox Hunters team of **Bruce Hayden NI1X**, **Jeremy Breef-Pilz KB1REQ** and **Richard Metcalf KB1TEH** came in second place in 1 hour and 20 minutes. They found the Fox hiding 7 miles from the Weston REPEATER site on a cul-de-sac on Cranberry Circle in Sudbury at the intersection of the Sudbury, Maynard, Acton and Concord town lines. About 70 miles from Raynham. The first place team found the Fox's Den in 1 hour and 5 minutes using Doppler System directional finding equipment.

We later found out that the Fox was varying the power from as low as 2 watts to as high as 50 watts and that explained some of our strange readings.



The South Shore Fox Hunters team got two very weak readings from the REPEATER site that pointed them west. Along the way the South Shore Fox Hunters got better readings pointing northwest toward Sudbury and Maynard. Once in Maynard the crew got one bad reading, then started to zero in on the Fox's Den.

Richard KB1TEH had a laptop computer with a mapping system that showed the area with a 10 mile radius around the location of the Weston REPEATER. A GPS system connected to the computer tracked our route. Richard KB1TEH could draw lines on the map based on the directional finding compass bearings. Another tool for the tool box.

The first place team of Fox Hunters came in with a time of 1 hour and 5 minutes. They were using a Doppler System – some components of which are shown in the photo.

The South Shore Fox Hunters found the Fox in a second place time of 1 hour and 20 minutes.

A 900MHz Fox Hunt was made available to anyone who wanted to participate. The 900MHz Fox Transmitter was built on a circuit board that was about 2 inches long and 1 inch wide with a 2 inch antenna and putting out milliwatts.



Doppler System setup for Fox Hunting


TECHNICAL TOPICS -- THE LIQUID ANTENNA

Current antennas are delicate

Dr. Michael Dickey, of North Carolina State University, put together a team of electrical and chemical engineers to find a more resilient antenna material that is soft at room temperature, can bend fluidly and self-heal as it gets whacked around.

The best mix they came up with was an alloy of gallium and indium. At room temperature it was actually a liquid and thus flowed when deformed, rather than breaking.

The antenna can be housed in a variety of covers, from rigid to rubber. The rubber-coated version will allow it to stretch like an elastic band. The antenna can therefore be tuned by stretching the rubber housing.

Along with the military applications that stimulated the project, it may be possible to make stress-detectors for civil engineering projects such as dams and bridges. If lots of flexible antennas attached to small radios sets were placed inside a bridge, they would expand or contract along with the bridge and so would constantly retune themselves. Engineers monitoring the bridge would just need to scan them with radio waves and see which wavelength they respond to, in order to find out what was going on.

The article was reported in the National Society of Professional Engineers weekly Engineering Press Review dated Jan. 18, 2010. **The Bruce NI1X** is wondering how long before we see a HAM radio application for a "liquid antenna".


