PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: This is **Paul N1VTI** – Field Day 2010 was a good social event with 26 Whitman Club members, 6 area HAMs and 7 guests able to participate at some time over the two day weekend of June 26 and June 27, 2010, The Field Day 2010 team set up 5 HF Base Stations and made 623 contacts with 38 States and 3 Canadian Provinces.

operate and test their equipment and skills and make as many radio contacts as possible during a given 24 hour period that lasted from 2 p.m. (EST) on Saturday, June 26 to 2 p.m. (EST) on Sunday, June 27, 2010.

FIELD DAY SITE -- OLD COLONY YMCA -- EAST BRIDGEWATER FACILITIES

The East Bridgewater Old Colony YMCA once again let the Whitman Amateur Radio Club hold Field Day 2010 on their East Bridgewater, MA Camp Satucket property. The combination of open field and wooded area provides an excellent location for Field Day activities. The tall pine trees are ideal for wire antennas and the 40 ft by 60 ft pavilion with roof and three open sides, was ideal for multiple operating positions.

THERE WERE FIVE (5) BASE STATIONS SET UP AT THE FIELD DAY SITE

<u>10-METER BASE STATION</u>: The Bruce NI1X set up his ICOM IC-706 Mark IIG HF transceiver as a 10-Meter Base Station using the Club's portable OUTBACKER vertical antenna.

The 10-Meter radio team made 38 contacts with states as far south as Florida and as far west as Arizona.

The Bruce NI1X made a contact with Jeremy Breef-Pilz KB1REQ who was operating as KB1JJE 1F EMA from the Mansfield Emergency Operations Center at the time.

20-METER BASE STATION: The crew set up the Club's ICOM IC-756 Pro transceiver as a 20-Meter Base Station. It was connected to the Club's Cushcraft R-5 vertical antenna.

The 20-Meter radio team made 127 contacts. On Sunday, after 80-Meters faded out, the radio team switched from the R-5 vertical to the horizontal Fritzel – off center fed dipole and the 20-Meter Base Station picked up another two dozen contacts. The 20-Meter station remained on the air until 2 p.m. Sunday.

The 20-Meter Base Station was using one of the laptop computer logging programs.

40-METER CW BASE STATION

Jim Ford NM1F set up his Kenwood TS-690S transceiver and his 40-meter Delta Loop antenna.

40-METER BASE STATION: Jeff Tracy N1SOM and Bill Tracy N1SON set up a 40-Meter Base Station in their camper using their ICOM IC-706 Mark IIG transceiver and the Club's 40-Meter dipole antenna.

Team Tracy brought their own generator and operated independently of the Club generator. The 40-Meter Base Station made 102 contacts over the 24 hour period. Both **Jeff N1SOM** and **Bill N1SON** stayed overnight and operated until about 2 a.m.

Team Tracy also had set up a 2-Meter / 440 MHz Kenwood 732 A transceiver and mag. mount antenna to Monitor the Whitman REPEATER.

The sling shot works well but we could use some spud gun launchers next year to help install antennas higher in the trees and orientate them in a Northeast - Southwest direction. We learn how to deal with intermod and how to work under less than optimum conditions. We found that ear phones are a must in a noisy environment. Another suggestion was to formally schedule operating shift times to keep the Base Stations On-The-Air continuously

and allow Club members to plan their day / weekend based on their scheduled operating time. Finally, we need to bring our First Aid - CERT - Go Kits along.

The outdoor Field Day sites represent locations like Red Cross Shelters where HAMs are expected to be up and running within a short time of arriving at their destination when all else fails. Other Field Day sites could be at one of the local city and town Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs) or a home stations where fixed antennas and commercial power are available. For some of the new HAMs - Field Day operation is their first introduction to the HF bands and the contest mode of operation – all under the guidance of a higher class Control Operator. By learning what works and what does not work - first hand - in the field - we will be better prepared for the real thing.
