MARSHFIELD FAIR -- AMATEUR RADIO EXHIBIT BOOTH

AND SPECIAL EVENT STATION -- NN1MF

The 143rd Annual Marshfield Fair (first held in 1867) was held on August 20 – 29, 2010. The Marshfield Fair is conducted by the Marshfield Agricultural & Horticultural Society and is loaded with arts and crafts and all kinds of exhibits along with Thrill Rides, Games of Chance, Outdoor Theater Stage, and plenty of Food Vendors.

Some of the exhibits and displays include Demolition Derbies, Truck Pulling, Blues Festival, Motorcross, Battle of the Bands, Racing Pigs, Antique Trucks & Tractor Show, Lawn Mower Racing, Bee Keepers, Blacksmith, Model Railroad, Draft Horses, Clydesdales, Rabbits, Dairy Cattle, Farm Animals, Wood Working, Bird Carving, Chain Saw Carving, Glass Blowing, Pottery, Birds of Prey, Vegetables, Flowers, and Quilts.

WORKING BEHIND THE SCENE

Working behind the scene was **Bill Hayden N1FRE** and **Paul Moss KB1MTW** who were coordinating our efforts with Marshfield Fair Director **Bridget Burns** and other Fair Officials.

On the Wednesday before the Fair opened - Bill N1FRE, Paul KB1MTW, and Al Drollett W1SM met with the Fair officials to pick up tickets and to scout out the new location and parking arrangements.

NN1MF is the call sign of the Marshfield Fair Radio Club of Marshfield, Massachusetts. The club was set up by the late **Bob Burns K1RB SK** of Whitman, who was a member of the Fair's Board of Directors and responsible for Advertising and Media Relations.

THE THURSDAY ANTENNA PARTY

The antenna crew set up **Paul Moss's KB1MTW** 2-meter ¼ wave vertical dipole that is mounted inside a PVC pipe about 10 feet off the ground. We had no problem reaching the Whitman REPEATER.

The crew also set up the Club's 3 band diamond 2-Meter / 440 MHz / 6-Meter vertical, also 10 feet off the ground and we monitored the Bridgewater REPEATER. The crew installed the Club's Cushcraft R-5 Vertical.

The crew then proceeded to install **Bill Hayden's N1FRE** 135 ft. long off-center-fed dipole "Fritzel" antenna in an East / West direction giving us 40-Meter and 80-Meter capabilities.

Ross W1EKG reported: "The Racal receiver was made in England. It is a model RA 17C-12 which was made for the U.S. market. It covers .5-30 MHz and has the "Wadley Loop" drift canceling oscillator circuit. It weighs in around 70 lbs and has 23 tubes!!! I actually own 3 of these radios and they're all different.

The other ones are an RA17L and an RA 17 MKII/C3. They all look the same and work in the same manner. The previous Saturday I brought a Collins R-390A and this past Saturday I brought a Hammarlund SP-600".






