PRESENTATION BY ED PERRY - OWNER OF THE MARSHFIELD RADIO STATION WATD

Ed Perry SWL – owner of the Marshfield Radio Station **WATD** - 95.9 FM - give a very informative and humorous talk about his adventures setting up private radio stations over the years. For those who weren't at the meeting - let's just say **Ed** has lived a very interesting and radioactive life.

Ed reported that he purchased his first AM radio station transmitter from the military as he left the Military Service and was involved with a home station, college stations and commercial radio stations in Brockton and Falmouth, before settling in Marshfield in 1977.

Ed reported that he truly enjoys operating the community radio station, WATD, which has 2000 watts of FM power and coverage over the South Shore. It gives him a chance to communicate with the public. He has a portable two way radio system that allows remote coverage of events in the community. His radio station is a private business that takes no tax payers money and must sell advertisements to secure funds. Ed reports that – like HAMs - he wants his radio station to be "on the air" during a disaster when all other communication is out of service and people are depending on portable radios to find out what is happening in the community. In closing – Ed told us the story about how, after several failed attempts to permit a station in Marshfield, he had an opportunity to purchase land next to the Marshfield dump. When this location was approved it seemed like the right thing to do at the time to name the radio station WATD "Were At The Dump". A tour of the radio station WATD is in the works.

Matt Paine W1AXB checked in to the WARPSN NET from the Blue Blue Hill tower at 650 feet.



TECHNICAL TOPICS

REMOTE BASE -- USING HAM RADIO DELUXE SOFTWARE By: Joe Casieri KA1JBE

I connected my ICOM IC-746 to the computer with an OPC-478 cable, this is to control the radio via the computer (you can do just about everything from the home computer) and <u>Hamradio Deluxe software</u>. If you want to use the radio remotely you must set it up in the software (easy to do), then you need to put the audio, both transmit and receive into the computer, I used the Signalink USB box, instead of wiring the radio and bringing audios to my sound card in the computer and dedicating it to my radio the signalink is a USB sound card. Then you have to get the audio to the remote computer, I used skype. I found that using a headset style speaker microphone works better than the internal one on the laptop. That's all there is to it.

I then made all the other transmissions from the RR station property as I rode around the two parking lots on my bike. I lucked out with a train coming through just in time for me to key the mike. I figured that would be discounted as a recorded sound. I gave other hints like riding around the empty parking lots, having a different vehicle, being a very visible Fox, being out of breath and stopping to rest. I thought that because of the smaller search area that the Fox Hunters wouldn't call foul because of the short deception at the start. In the real world we probably would be tracking a moving stuck mike more than a fixed one. I liked the way things turned out. I think being found on the road was the highlight."
