



Joe KA1JBE was hiding in a busy parking lot at the soccer field off Belmont Street in East Bridgewater and kept the first place Fox Hunters at bay for 1 hour and 15 minutes. Great Hunt – don't believe a word the Fox says. Forget about the shopping carts, the large body of water, the color of the cars or the tape recorded sounds of a local train whistle. Trust your equipment.

Richard KB1TEH was cruising the parking lot within 20 minutes – pulled up behind a car with a 2-meter antenna, looked at the car but saw no one in it and left the field when the Fox said he was not cross band repeating.

It took **The Bruce NI1X** about 1 hour to work his way from Raynham to East Bridgewater center where the Fox signal was strong. Then, with the help of **Richard KB1TEH**, worked his way north and west of East Bridgewater Center and found the Fox's signal getting stronger. **The Bruce NI1X** finally found the soccer field on Belmont Street and slowly cruised up and down the row of cars two or three times looking for people, saw no one and left the lot.

Upon finding **Richard KB1TEH** in another part of the field area and saying that all indications were that the Fox was in the large main parking lot – **The Bruce NI1X** went back with no antenna on the YAESU VX-7R and it peaked within one car length of the car with the 2-Meter antenna. **The Bruce NI1X** then parked his car – got out and walked up to the car - which was the only car in the lot with the windows part way open - and found the Foxes reclined in their seats out of sight at the 1 hour and 15 minute mark. **Richard KB1TEH** was walking in from the other end of the parking lot.

Roy KB1CYV reported that he was mystified by the good signals and reflections received near East Bridgewater Center and finally had to be sent north by hints from the Fox. John N1PRK has built a 2-Element directional antenna and Judy KB1SRO was using signal strength and body fading. Jim KB1PFL got a late start but joined in anyway.

SOUTH SHORE HOSPITAL AMATEUR RADIO CLUB -- PUBLIC SERVICE PROJECT

Karen Trask KB1UBX reports: "On Saturday, May 21st the South Shore Hospital Amateur Radio Club - W1SSH - met for their first official assignment outside of the hospital. We provided communication support at Southfield (formally known as Weymouth Naval Air Station) for a hospital coordinated road race. The race was sponsored by The Friends of South Shore Hospital and it was their annual Road Race for Cardiovascular Care. The Friends support the hospital through volunteerism, raising funds for needed programs, and building goodwill for the hospital within the community".

Karen KB1UBX further reports: "We assembled at 07:30 a.m. at the Gym parking lot and then checked in with the race coordinators to receive our assignments. John KB1QEM acted as Net Control at the Gym building. The rest of us were deployed along the race route. The two ambulance teams were kind enough to give us a lift to each area. In doing the initial radio check, on Simplex 146.850 MHz, it was discovered that John K1BBM and I were unable to get anything other than a poor quality signal with Net Control. That's when John K1BBM tried his Diamond RH77CA -1/4 wave antenna with some success but it was the MFJ-1714 - 1/2 wave antenna that allowed us to maintain communication. John KB1QEM Net Control also moved away from the DJ and his equipment to further facilitate communication. Although we thought we were on level ground we later discovered that Net Control was actually in a bit of a valley.

All went well with no serious incidents during the race. The weather was cool and overcast which was perfect for the runners as well as the crews standing by. A great time was had by all and we look forward to many more events".

Rob KD1CY reviewed the guide for reporting Severe Weather to National Weather Service (NWS) Taunton, MA. The power point presentation included lots of pictures of cloud formations, tornado damage, hail, tree damage, structural damage, street flooding and a dramatic video of a street collapse.

Rob KD1CY said to call NWS Taunton when you observe Tornados or Funnel Clouds, Wall clouds, Hail (be specific with regards to size - report in inches or parts of an inch - do not report marble size Hail because marbles come in different sizes). Winds 40 MPH or greater (specify if measured or estimated). Large 4 inch or greater branches, trees or power lines down by wind and structural damage to building roofs, windows, etc. caused by wind. Rainfall - 1 inch or more in an hour and 2



inches or more as a storm total. Street flooding 1 foot depth across all of the road or road closed and streams / rivers when water is leaving their banks. Winter weather - 1 / 4 inch of radial ice (center outward) - when conditions change from rain to sleet or snow to freezing rain - thunder when accompanied by snow, New snowfall – first 2 inches then every 2-3 inches thereafter – snow fall rates at least 1 inch per hour – give final snow storm total.

The "Prevailing Winds" is now on line along with NWS Taunton Spotter Re-Training and a NWS Taunton Retraining Quiz. Go to www.erh.noaa.gov/box and then click on SKYWARN Training to get to Prevailing Winds, NWS Taunton Spotter Re-Training and NWS Taunton Re-Training Quiz.

Amateur Radio Operators are the first ones getting the word out in the critical first few hours and the first few days following a disaster as the rest of the system comes back on line. When all else fails amateur radio is the last line of defense. All Whitman Club members are encouraged to sign up to be SKYWARN Observers and to sign up and register your equipment and availability with the Amateur Radio Emergency Service. Jim W1JT and I attended the DX Dinner. It was a good time, even if we didn't win a prize. We left on Sunday and decided to do the drive home in 1 day. Actually, it went really well and it was 14 hrs from our hotel in Dayton to our driveway. Best news was that I got a Wouxun hand held 2-Meter / 440 MHz radio. I had a lot of fun being able to communicate with all of our friends while we were there. I'm looking forward to next year's Hamvention. Jim W1JT reports he brought home a 275 foot delta loop and Tom Wilson W1ICU helped him put it up".

Jeff Lehmann N1ZZN reported: "Overall, my Dayton Hamvention experience was very enjoyable. It began on Wednesday when I drove down to NJ to meet my friends Michael KC2MTM and Nick W2NJL. We headed west from the Trenton area at 7:30 on Thursday morning. Around noon, we stopped for lunch in Belle Vernon, PA where we had lunch with a friend of mine that I'd recently gotten back in touch with. This was the first time we'd seen each other since I moved out of Holbrook in 1992 (she'd moved in '96), so almost 20 years. We arrived in the Dayton area around 7 PM, where we stayed at the Springhill Suites, south of Dayton near routes 75 & 675".

DAYTON OHIO ARRL HAMVENTION AND OUTDOOR FLEA MARKET

Jeff Lehmann N1ZZN Cont: "We arrived at the Hamvention Friday morning just after 9, and spent most of the day in the flea market outside. I ended up not even seeing everything outside on Friday, with the careful pace we walked the flea market to make sure we saw everything. I also spent some time in the inside exhibits, but did not attend any forums. I met up with most of the other HAMs from the south shore here and there around the flea market on both days. On Saturday I covered the areas of the flea market not seen on Friday first, and then quickly scanned through the rest. I didn't make any big purchases in the flea market, but did find a cheap rotor, and various cables and adaptors.

I made my big purchase of the event on Saturday, a Perseus software defined radio. This radio is only a receiver, but is regarded as one of the best quality receivers of any type available. Several of my friends that are avid DXers of the medium wave AM broadcast band swear by it, because of it's filters, ability to adjust bandwidth, and especially the ability to record an entire 1.6 MHz piece of the spectrum, and go back and review it later, just as if you were using the radio real time. There are also downconverters available to tune other frequency ranges besides 10 kHz - 40 MHz. I plan on eventually getting the one that covers 80-120 MHz, to use as another tool DXing the FM broadcast band.

After leaving Hamvention on Saturday afternoon, we started back east toward Pittsburgh, PA. Along the way we stopped to see the historic transmitter site of 1170 AM WWVA, in Saint Clairesville, OH, just outside Wheeling, WV. Last summer, all three of this station's self supported towers were blown down in a wind storm, after standing for decades. There are now 3 more typical guyed towers in their place. On Sunday, we went to the Pittsburgh Pirates/Detroit Tigers game at beautiful PNC Park. There seemed to not be a bad seat in the stadium, and seeing the game there was very enjoyable.

I certainly would recommend that every HAM make the trip to Dayton at least once, whether by driving or flying. This was my 5th Hamvention. I had so much fun this year, that I may have to go back as soon as next year".
