In addition there were 11 Whitman Club members and at least 37 area HAMS who could not make it to the Marshfield Fair but were able to check in with **NN1MF** via 2-Meters radio. The Radio Team made 203 HF contacts with 31 States, (plus Puerto Rico), 27 foreign countries, and 4 Canadian Provinces.

THE ANTENNA PARTY



Paul Moss KB1MTW built a modified Spud Gun Launcher (compressed air powered) that shoots a fishing line over the tallest trees. You can see the PVC bullet leaving the barrel in the two photos if you look close enough.



The day before the Marshfield Fair started - the Set up crew installed the Club's Cushcraft R-5 HF vertical and a Diamond 50X 2-Meter vertical behind the radio shack.

The crew also installed the Club's Off Center Fed dipole - all band Windom antenna between the grand stand railing and a tree in the back yard.

The crew brought tables, chairs, radios, antennas, display boards, Morse Code handouts, QST magazines, ARRL handouts, QSL Card display. Bottled water, cooler, Club banners, code practice oscillator, hand crank generator, sun tent and plastic rain tarp.

PORTABLE VISE GRIP 'C' CLAMP MOUNT

The crew also set up **Bill Hayden's N1FRE** 40-Meter HAM stick vertical antenna, clamped to the display table, with a counterpoise wire run around the shack. **Bill N1FRE** reports: "This unit has a stainless steel angle with a standard 3/8-24" insulated receptacle lug wired with a short length of Mini-8 coax cable and a PL259. A 1/4-20" stud is tapped and screwed into the side of the vise grip. A wing nut and flat washer allows a random piece of wire to be attached here and strung out as a counterpoise".

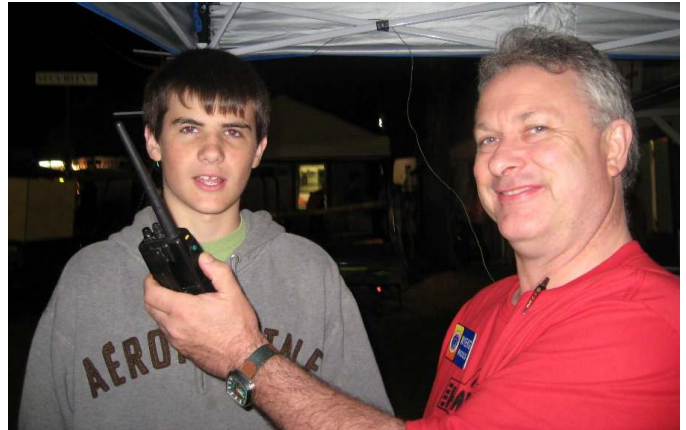

Once again **Ross Hochstrasser W1EKG** brought some working Boat Anchors.

MORE DISPLAY BOARDS AND NEW IDEAS

We had several volunteers with new display boards and new ideas. **Ross Hochstrasser W1EKG** and **Judy Attaya-Harris KB1SRO** were walking among the fair patrons and broadcasting "Live From The Fair". **Judy KB1SRO** volunteered to bring the ARRL Display Board that she had made up for Field Day. 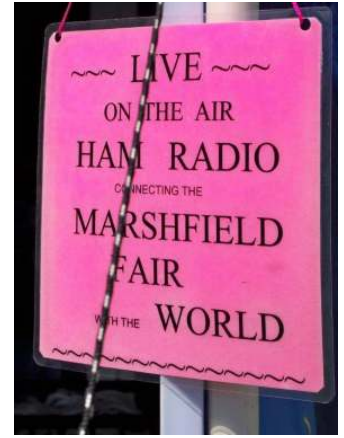

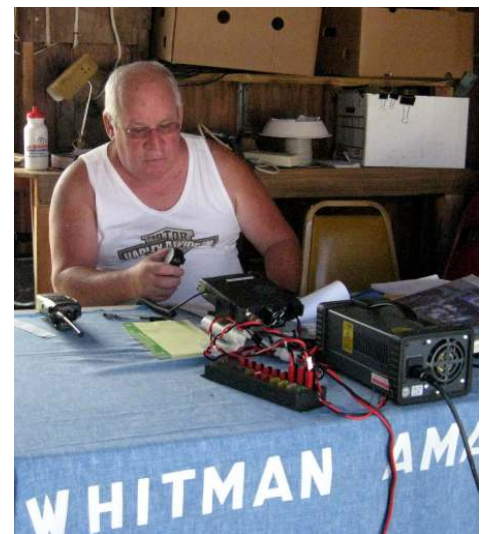

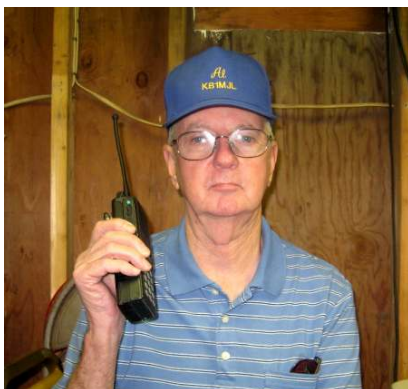
