



**Barry N1EZH** reports: "My wife **Diane N1JCK** and I went on vacation to Las Vegas, Nevada and I brought some radio gear along.

In the photo I am standing on the Hoover Dam and behind me, in the background, is the new Hoover Dam Bypass Bridge. I took the picture of the Hoover Dam from on top of the new bridge which is a little over 900 feet above the Colorado River and well above the height of the Hoover Dam.


A little history from **The Bruce NI1X**: "Following 9/11 no trucks were allowed to cross over the Hoover Dam and the Hoover Dam By Pass Bridge, which had been all designed but put on hold, was put on a fast track and opened last year. The bridge is about 2000 feet long and is very unique because it was designed with a free standing, self supporting, arch".

**Barry N1EZH** also reports: "I brought my Portable HT setup which consisted of my Kenwood TH-F6A Triband Handheld, an Opek Mini Magmount, and a Comet HT-224 Tri-Band HT antenna. The only challenge I had was to find a metal base on which to place my magmount. In the past I have been able to find something in the unit we are staying at, but only aluminum or plastic were found. I finally went to the local Ace Hardware and purchased a round shallow ceiling box which I can bring with me to use on future trips.

I was able to get into the one of the local Las Vegas Repeaters on 146.490 MHz and made contact most every morning while staying out there.

I also used my Android HTC Evo 4G Phone to make several EchoLink contacts on our local Bridgewater 147.180 MHz and Whitman 147.225 MHz Repeaters to check in during our weekly Nets. I was also able to do the same on Saturday, October 15th to talk with the **KC1TAC** and **WA1NPO** JOTA Stations prior to our departure for home".


# SKYWARN RECOGNITION DAY -- December 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> 2011
