
#### **TECHNICAL TOPICS**

#### TEN - TEC HB1B QRP TRANSCEIVER

At the August meeting **Jim O'Rourke WG1L** brought in his Ten Tec HB1B QRP rig for Show and Tell. The QRP rig is the smaller box shown on top of a low power MFJ tuner in the photo.

**Jim WG1L** reports that the HB1B QRP rig is good for 20, 30, 40 and 80-Meters. The unit comes fully assembled, receives SSB and CW but transmits CW only. The output power is 4 watts on 12 volts and 5 watts on 13.8 volts.

**Jim WG1L** also reports that he has been testing the QRP rig with good success with his friend **Jack WF1S** in Georgia on 40-Meters.

#### PROGRAMMING A BAOFENG HT TRANSCEIVER

Larry Kenney K1LJK reports: "I brought my laptop, which has the "Chirp" programming software loaded, to the Whitman Club August meeting. This software is used to program frequencies into the small Chinese Baofeng HT radios.

I was speaking with **Bill K1UFO** and I offered to update his Baofeng handheld transceiver and also **Fred's KC1ACG** Baofeng with a set of local repeater and simplex frequencies that I have in my Baofeng.



The Club meeting was the our first chance to get together and get the HT's programmed. The Baofengs are great little radios but not that easy to manually program". If anyone would like some help programming - let me know.

## CAMPER HAM SHACK By: Jim O'Rourke WG1L MORSE CODE IS ALIVE AND WELL

**Jim O'Rourke WG1L** reports: "Here is a picture of my portable rig set up that I use when camping. It is an ICOM IC-725, a switching power supply and an MFJ tuner all mounted in a milk crate for portability.

I installed a short length of PVC pipe (with a screw cap when not in use) for the coax to come thru the back of the camper, the coax sticks out into the room just enough for me to get hold of it and pull it into the rig.

My key is an MFJ Bencher type with the keyer mounted on top. It only takes a couple minutes to set up or break down.

The antenna is a G5RV Jr. that is good for 10 thru 40-Meters. I mainly use 40-Meters so that works out great. It is about 25 - 30 feet high above the camper. I used the Club spud gun to shoot the lines over the branches".

Next I want to drive a ground rod into the ground behind the camper and run a length of braided ground wire into the rig".

Jim WG1L is a member of the FISTS Club that is dedicated to the further use of Morse code on the amateur radio bands and also reports: "I am on 7.066 MHz (CW) at 2330 utc with Jack WF1S in Kings Bay, GA. most every night for an hour or more. Where I am on the air that much - I don't make a lot of other contacts".




WHITMAN AMATEUR RADIO PUBLIC SERVICE NET (WARPSN)
