RADIO'S SENT TO THE PHILLPPINES: BY KAREN TRASK

According to an article in today's Boston Globe "The typhoon that recently barreled through the Philippines has left in its wake one of the most profound resettlement crisis in decades, with the number of newly homeless far exceeding the capacity of aid groups and the government to respond." I am told by amateur radio folk that the Philippines had lost as much as 80% of their Ham radio equipment.

Last Saturday I shipped the four Baofung HT radios to the Philippine Amateur Radio Association (PARA) in Manila. Many thanks to the Whitman Amateur Radio Club members for their generosity in purchasing these HT's. We all Thank Karen for taking on this monumental task and running with it from start to finish, Karen did an outstanding job and again we all thank her.

The World Radiosport Team Championship (WRTC:

The World Radiosport Team Championship (WRTC) will be held in

Massachusetts July 12-13, 2014. Like the Olympics or the Boston Marathon, this event draws the "best of the best" from around the world. Fifty-nine two-operator teams will be set up with Field-Day-style stations on 16 properties around the Route 495 corridor, from Pepperell in the north to Plymouth and Taunton in the south.

The international teams will compete to see which team can make the most contacts with the most countries and take home the gold medal. This Olympic-style world championship will be widely covered in the local, regional, and national media and provide excellent publicity for amateur radio.

The WRTC2014 organizers need volunteers to help with this once-in-a-lifetime event. The biggest need at the moment is for people to help set up and keep an eye on the stations and provide local transportation for the teams between the headquarters hotel in Westborough and the sites.

Several clubs in the area have "adopted" one or more sites. Paul, KB1MTW has set-up a specker for the May meeting to come in and talking to the club about the event in detail.
