Did you know that Slow Scan TeleVision is alive and well and on board the International Space Station? After reading the following article I started to download SSTV software so I can try to join in on the fun.

RUSSIAN SSTV FROM THE ISS Russian Slow Scan Television or SSTV transmissions are planned from the International Space Station on December 18 and 20. The transmit frequency will be 145.800 MHz with a 3 minute off time between transmissions. The expected mode is PD180 producing a high quality image with a frame scan of 187 seconds. A total of 12 different photos will be sent throughout an operation period. Image transmissions for December 18th should begin around 14:20 UTC and on December. 20th look for signals to start around 12:40 UTC. For both days, operation is expected to terminate around 21:30 UTC. Please note that the SSTV operation times may change due to any launch delays of the SpaceX CRS-5 scheduled for

December 16th. Received images can be uploaded to the image gallery found at tinyurl.com/december-2014-ariss-sstv (ARISS, AA4KN)



Training Update:

- Bill W1ACO will reach out to Charlie W1CBR regarding future training classes to be scheduled.
- Paul KB1MTW suggests at least 2 additional volunteers are needed for assistance
 w/training classes in order to more easily share the work load amongst a 4 person
 team. Paul reminded us of the VA Hospital training opportunity as well as a new
 potential opportunity coming soon.
- Jim W1JT asks for volunteers to help support the training effort. Jack W1AKN volunteered to help. Jack will reach out to Bill W1ACO and Charlie W1CBR
- Paul KB1MTW introduced a guest at the meeting: Noah KB1VWZ who attends
 Bridgewater State University. Noah reports he's asked, on occasion about ham radio
 by some fellow students. Paul indicated this could be a training opportunity for the
 Whitman club

Plimouth Plantation Special Event November 28th-30th:

- Jim W1JT kicked off a general discussion concerning the clubs involvement in this
 years Plimouth Plantation Special Event operation. Jim informed us he and Bill N1FRE
 have been working on this project for the last few weeks.
- Bill N1FRE reports he had finally reached a Plimouth Plantation contact after several non returned phone calls and was surprised at the unenthusiastic response to our request to operate there on Thanksgiving weekend (a first in 25 years for Plimouth Plantation special event operations).
- Jim W1JT reports he is pursuing this effort of securing our use of the Plimouth
 Plantation facilities for our Thanksgiving weekend Special Event operations with the
 current marketing department representatives. It was felt membership in the Plimouth
 Plantation could be established to strengthen the relationship with the Whitman
 Amateur Radio Club. Garry W1GRC asked what the yearly membership cost is. Jim
 understands it to be \$99/year for a single membership.
- A general discussion took place w/various suggestions from club members to mitigate
 the situation. A motion to purchase a \$99 membership at the Plimouth Plantation made
 by John KB1SVY with a second by Mike KB10EP. Motion passed quorum vote. Jim
 W1JT will establish a membership asap and continue to pursue use of the plantation
 for our Thanksgiving special event asap. Jim W1JT will make a general
 announcement via email to all club members once the matter is settled (hopefully in
 our favor).
- Bill N1FRE suggests we continue the practice to providing a thank you letter, copy of the Whitman club newsletter featuring our special event stations at the plantation and any newspaper articles featuring this event this year, assuming the event does take place.

Old Business:

- Paul KB1MTW thanked everyone who helped out w/the recent JOTA (Jamboree On The Air) event held at Camp Norse in Kingston. Paul reports 1HF station and 3 2-Meter stations were on the air. Paul also estimates 200-250 scouts utilized the stations during the event. Paul indicated **Dob Burke KB1LXH** maintained the station logs and would have the details if anyone was interested. **Barry N1EZH** estimates he spoke to 87 scouts himself.
- Paul N1VTU reports in a similar fashion to JOTA, he recently was in contact w/a
 grammar school in Washington DC using a club call on 20-Meters. 5 Students made
 contact w/Paul. A general discussion took place on recent and past amateur radio
 activities by high school & grammar school children.
- Ross W1EKG reviewed a recent Sunday visit to the Wing Busters model r/c airfield
 w/several other Whitman club members. Ross suggests this might be a good location
 for to run the Sunday morning public service net control from on occasion. He also
 noted that they do serve breakfast from time to time at the field. The field is open year
 round (pending weather conditions). Bill W1ACO described his experience w/the Wing
 Busters club and at one time in the past, they occupied an adjacent booth w/us at the
 Marshfield Fair.
- Paul KB1MTW reviewed the recent activities at NEARFest in Deerfield NH. Paul
 reported the weather was ok/not great and only a moderate crowd of folks were there
 on Saturday. Ross W1EKG reminded us the NEARFest weekend was also a holiday
 weekend which may have contributed to the lighter than average Saturday crowd.
 Ross also reports there will no admission charge to attend next springs NEARFest
 (vehicles will still be charged to park to within the gates however).

• Jeff N1ZZN inquired about the recent plan to clean out the Quonset hut/club house. - Paul KB1MTW reminded us that last month Bob Pratt was interested in having his
 tower removed and donated to the Whitman club. Joe KA1JBE contacted Bob and
 reports it's an 80 foot tower w/a rotor which has been up in place for about 25 years.
 Bob indicated anytime we want to take it is fine. He indicated this could wait until the
 spring as well. Bill N1FRE also reports he knows of a 40 foot tower also available.
- **Bill N1FRE** reminded us of the recent ham radio article in the November 3rd Brockton Enterprise featuring **Mark KC1ACF**.
- Paul KB1MTW reports Pete N1POO has been in touch w/recent silent key Bob
 Johnson's window and has removed 12 sections of Rohn tower and several antennas.
 Pete is storing this at his house. Jim W1JT suggests we might want to sell these if we don't envision using these.
- Jim W1JT mentioned he is selling (best offer) patio furniture and the money will be donated to the Whitman club. Contact Jim if interested.
- **Jim KC1JET** reported 2 new amateur radio operators passed their technician license test on November 1st at the conclusion of the training class held at the Morton Hospital in Taunton.
- N1VTI reminds us this time of year the W1SSH South Shore Hospital amateur radio club typically asks for help w/their Santa project. Paul reports there's some question as to this operation taking place this year- as such, there's currently no request for help or for donations.
- Jim W1JT reminds us the FARA-Fest is coming up this Saturday.
- Roy KB1CTV reported the November 3rd Brockton Enterprise contained an article

featuring **Paul KB1MTW** and his SKYWARN involvement. Roy asked if Paul could highlight SKYWARN to the club. Paul indicated SKYWARN is reorganizing due to the retirement of **Carl N1FY**. Paul also explained the National Weather Service will have new meteorological data available in the spring. Secretary's Report, December 2014:

President **Jim Tovet W1JT** called the meeting to order at 6:59 pm, 12/3/14. A quorum was present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and the roll call commenced.

Treasurer, **Jeff N1SOM** read the November treasurers report. Motion to accept the report as read made by **Barry N1EZH**, with a second from **Ross W1EKG**. Motion passed quorum vote.

The November Secretary's report was made available on the club web site in PDF format and will also be included in the upcoming November/December club newsletter. Motion to accept the report as published made by **Joe KA1JBE**, with a second from **Mark KC1ACF**. Motion passed quorum vote.

Old Business:

- General comments were made regarding the recent Thanksgiving Weekend special event operations at Plimouth Plantation.
 - Barry N1EZH commented on enjoying the event
 - Jim W1JT commented on making contact with Plymouth England and speaking w/someone located at the location where the Mayflower sailed from. Jim also spoke w/someone who had made contact w/the Whitman club on Thanksgiving for the 33rd time
 - Mark KC1ACF commented on use of the 2Meter beam rather than the onmidirectional antenna at the administration building improved access to the Whitman repeater quite a bit.
 - Paul N1VTU commented on the possibility of locating station antennas on the balcony area at the visitors center as we did in the past. A short discussion took place regarding this. It's not clear if access to the balcony is possible any longer.

- Paul N1VTI asked why we didn't setup a station at the Hornblower House as we've
 done in the past. Jim W1JT explained it was in use by the Plantation and not
 available for our use this year.
- Ross W1EKG asked if we had purchased a Plimouth Plantation membership? Jim W1JT answered no, we had not purchased a membership. Ross further commented possively on the idea of establishing a club membership if possible.
- Mark KC1ACF reports he spoke w/an administration person while at the Administration building and she recommended we plan our event 1 week before Thanksgiving weekend.
- Jim W1JT recalled a suggestion made by Brad W1AY at a previous club meeting to meet in January 2015 and begin planning all events for the new year. At that time, this option of moving the Thanksgiving weekend event to the previous weekend would be discussed.
- Paul KB1MTW commented that we should provide a written thank you to Plimouth Plantation and include a copy of the clubs newsletter highlighting this special event.
 Jim W1JT indicated he has the email addresses to send this to when available.
- Mike WA1MAD commented that including a copy of the QSL card from the Plimouth England station would be a very good idea.
- Paul N1VTI commented we had setup a link to Santa in the past at the Plimouth Plantation, which was well received.
- Jeff N1ZZN offered to setup the Plimouth Plantation QSL certificates. Jim W1JT offered to print these out. Jeff suggests we provide certificates to non-club members who provide a full size self addressed stampted envelope.
- Jim W1JT thanked everyone who helped w/the clubs recent Quonset Hut Clean Out
 effort which was all done within a 2 1/2 hr window of time. A general discussion took
 place on the next steps needed to improve the club building and it's use for club
 activities.
 - The bulding itself can comfortably hold 20-30 people which is to small for our typical club meeting attendance (approx 40-50 on average). The floor and heating system appear to need repair work, as well as general interior cleaning and painting.
 - Jeff N1ZZN suggests we use the building to hold special projects/classes.
 - The cost of Quonset Hut improvements was discussed and led to a general discussion on club funds (\$). **Jim W1JT** highlights the potential cost of Quonset Hut improvements and other club expeditures could deplete the clubs funds. A review took place on general operating costs against club money taken in, including membership dues and the clubs subsidizing approx \$30 of the total \$50 cost for new Whitman club blue jackets to members. Several fund raising suggestions were made to offset the cost of the Quonset Hut improvement expenditures and in general to give the club a larger financial operating base (additional raffles at club meetings, selling advertising space in our newsletter, increasing membership dues (and if so by how much?) and eliminating the club jacket subsidization.
 - For a persective, it was mentioned other area clubs have dues of approx \$20/yr. It
 was suggested a \$5 increase in dues be made and also establishing a seperate
 fund specifically for the Quonset Hut improvement project, allowing members to
 contribute additional money directly for this cause.
 - Several members suggested we need an accurate estimate on the intended Quonset Hut repairs to establish a working project budget. Most agreed this should be worked into an overall club budget for all 2015 events. One suggestion was for the board of directors to assemble a budget proposal and present it to the club membership in January.

- Motion to eliminate the clubs subsidization of club jackets costs starting January 1st 2015 made by Mark KC1ACF with a second by Brad W1AY. Motion passed quorum vote. (jacket cost will now be approx \$50, depending on size)
- A general discussion took place regarding the raising of yearly membership dues including the amount of a potential increase, it's potential affect of club membership, the timing as to when an increase can be made per club by-laws and if notification of this intended motion be given to all club members prior to a vote. It was mentioned that per club by-laws, an inclease in dues membership must be voted on prior to the start of the following membership year (Jan 1st 2015). Motion to raise the yearly club membership dues by \$5 to \$25 made by **Mark KC1ACF** with a second by **Jim KC1JET**. The motion passed quorum vote.

New Business:

- Mark KC1ACF informed the club on December 13th he will be attending the Hanson holiday celebration at the town hall and will be on the Whitman club repeater and possibly also tracking Santa using APRS!
- Ross W1EKG recently spoke w/Jerry Scampoli at CranLand and we are welcome back again next year!



As you all know, each week at the conclusion of our Sunday Whitman Amateur Radio Public Service Net, we pass traffic to Loren N1IQI. This traffic consists of a basic msg and a count of stations checking into our net. We hear this traffic designated for KW1U Marsha Ford who is the Eastern Massachusetts section traffic manager. This message becomes part of the NTS (National Traffic Service).

Loren N1IQI not only passed this traffic but quite a bit more each month as part of the NTS. He provides a monthly total of messages sent, received and delivered (SAR report) as well as scoring totals for his participation in the NTS system (PSHR report). Here's brief explaination of each element:

SAR S/ss D/dd R/rr T/tt

(sent ss msgs, delivered dd msgs, received rr msgs, total msgs tt)

Sent -- Every message sent over the air from your station to another amateur receives a point in this category. Thus, a message that is eligible for an Originated point as above receives another point when it is sent on the air. Likewise, a message that is received on the air conveys a Sent point when it is relayed to another station. A message that you initiate yourself, while it gets no Originated point, gets a Sent point when cleared. All Sent points require on-the-air sending.

Received -- A message received over the air gets a Received point, whether received for relaying (sending) or for delivery to the addressee. Any message received which is not eligible for a Delivery point (such as one addressed to yourself) is nevertheless eligible for a Received point.

Delivered -- The act of delivery of a message to a third party receives a point in this category, in addition to a Received point. This is strictly an off-the-air function and must be coupled with receipt of the message at your station. Thus you can't get a Delivered point unless you first get a Received point.

PSHR (Public Service Honor Roll : catagory/points) 1/? 2/? 3/? 4/? 5/? 6/? T/?

PSHR CATEGORIES

This listing is to recognize radio amateurs whose public service performance during the month indicted qualifies for 70 or more total points in the following 6 categories (as reported to their Section Managers). Please note the maximum points for each category:

1.) Participating in a public service net, using any mode. --1 point per net session; maximum 40.

- **2.)** Handling formal messages (radiograms) via any mode. --1 point for each message handled; maximum 40.
- **3.)** Serving in an ARRL-sponsored volunteer position: ARRL Field Organization appointee or Section Manager, NTS Net Manager, TCC Director, TCC member, NTS official or appointee above the Section level. -- 10 points for each position; maximum 30.
- **4.)** Participation in scheduled, short-term public service events such as walk-a-thons, bike-athons, parades, simulated emergency tests and related practice events. This includes off-the-air meetings and coordination efforts with related emergency groups and served agencies.-- 5 points per hour (or any portion thereof) of time spent in either coordinating and/or operating in the public service event; no limit.
- **5.)** Participation in an unplanned emergency response when the Amateur Radio operator is on the scene. This also includes unplanned incident requests by public or served agencies for Amateur Radio participation. -- 5 points per hour (or any portion thereof) of time spent directly involved in the emergency operation; no limit.
- **6.)** Providing and maintaining a) an automated digital system that handles ARRL radiogramformatted messages; b) a Web page e-mail list server oriented toward Amateur Radio public service -- 10 points per item.
