He hooked it all up And in record time, quickly Worked 100 countries, All down on 160.



#### **Old Business:**

- Larry K1LJK reviewed the summarized results from contacts made during the Plimoth Plantation Thanksgiving weekend special event.
  - 40 Meter contacts: 92
    20 Meter contacts: 48
    2 Meter contacts: 27
    Total HF contacts: 140
    Total VHF contact: 27
  - Total combined contacts: 167 from 23 US states and 11 Foreign Countries.
- Paul KB1MTW reviewed the overall Plimoth Plantation special event:
  - Paul thanked everyone who participated in the event; the antenna party setup & take-down teams, operators who came to the plantation and folks who contacted the stations during the event.
  - The decision was made during event setup on Friday to run two station locations rather than three: at the visitor center and at the admin building.
  - Unfortunately problems w/the Icom 756 HF club radio were encountered Saturday morning at the admin building. Mark KC1ACF volunteered use of his Kenwood TS-930S HF radio and the admin HF station was making contacts on 40 Meters by mid-day on Saturday. Big thanks for club members

- Richard AG1B, Jim W1JT, Barry N1EZH and all others who helped w/radio checks and suggested rig setup changes during this time.
- A general conversation took place on the state of the Icom 756 radio with a
  motion to approve sending the rig to Icom for diagnosis/repair if necessary
  made by Jeff N1ZZN with a second by Jeff WK1D. Motion passed quorum
  vote. Mark KC1ACF and Jim KB1PFL volunteered to look at the rig on the
  bench and run additional tests before sending to Icom.
- Bill N1FRE suggested the club respond in writing to the Plimoth Plantation management, thanking them for use of the facility and providing them a club certificate with summarized contact details. A general discussion took place. Joe K1JMA will reach out to the management folks he dealt with when arranging this event and present this to them. Mike WA1MAD thanked Joe K1JMA on behalf of the club membership for all his work in arranging this event with the Plimoth Plantation management.

- Mark KC1ACF provided an update on acquisition of the Plymouth County tower site in Hanson. Public notice of our clubs intentions have officially been made and should run for approx 4-6 weeks in the local newspapers, etc. A general discussion took place on use and possible repair of the existing building at the tower location. Structural integrity of the build (floor) is in question. Jeff N1ZZN also mentioned testing of the exising onsite coax & hardline hasn't been done yet. In general it was agreed we need to know what it would take to restore this proposed repeater site to proper operation. Jeff N1ZZN mentioned we are able to stay at our current temporary repeater location for now and also spoke w/Gary AB1CQ recently who confirmed the cell carrier at our original repeater site has not plans to fix the RF interference issue. John WD1L asked about removing the new antenna from our original repeater site. Jeff N1ZZN commented the move would best be done once when we move to the Hanson tower.

#### Old Business:

- Paul KB1MTW updated everyone on the recent NEAR-FEST club table activity and sales (as reflected in the treasurer's report). Paul also mentioned the newly purchased large canopy worked out very well. A general discussion took place on the need for a large duffle bag (possibly a hockey bag) able to store the canopy and it's parts (including the approx 40-42 inch long supports). John KC1DWY offered to purchase and donate a military duffle bag for this purpose (Thanks John!)
- Ross W1EKG updated everyone on the ongoing Technician class being held at the Whitman Police station. The class has approx 13 students who will test at a VE session being planned for Dec 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Police Station.

#### **New Business:**

- **Richard AG1B** informed everyone of an upcoming FoxHunt using his automated FoxBox system on Saturday and Sunday November 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> in the Halifax area. Richard provided another demo for the club members with instructions on it's use for Fox Hunting. (see section later in this document regarding the Fox Hunt results)
- Mark KC1ACF provided an update on the clubs potential use of the Plymouth County/Hanson municipal tower as a new home for the clubs repeater. Mark indicated the normal process is being followed whereby public notice of our proposal is in place for a period of time (In newspapers for example). A general discussion tool place on use of the building and coax/hardline that remains at the site. Kevin KB1MOC provided an update on the lack of structural integrity in the building. Use of a Connex secure storage unit onsite was discussed. Mark KC1ACF indicated he has fencing available for use onsite if necessary. Also mentioned, Jeff N1ZZN and Garry AB1CQ would be evaluating the coax left onsite for possible club use. (important note: the tower also requires replacement of a broken guy wire).



Also mentioned was possible use of Bill N1FRE's tower at Pine St. A general discussion took place on which tower should be designated for use at Pine St and which should be sold. It was suggested an antenna/tower committee be formed who will evaluate all options and present these to the club membership. This led to a discussion concerning the need for physical repairs/upgrades to the Pine St building itself and the need for a contractor to spec the work. I checked the 146.535 Mh Fox Box at 7:30AM, Saturday (Nov 7th), and met **Jim KB1PFL** who had just located the FoxBox on his way home from work. Congratulations to Jim! Jim reports that he could hear the Fox Box from 3-4 miles away.

The signal is strong at the parking area so use the VFO on your HT and move off frequency a step or two in order to attenuate the signal for body shielding method.

The Fox Box is off the trail but within 300 feet of the Kiosk. The sign-in list is in a ziplock at the base of a tree marked with flagging tape and ribbons.

The Fox Box is camouflaged for security.

Location-Striar Conservancy Woodlands on Rt 105 Halifax, about 2 miles south of Rt 106 intersection.

Fox Box- 146.535 Mh activate by transmitting DTMF 2 for two seconds .

**Chris N1CFB** and **Mike WA1MAD** showcased their Go Kits at the Nov 4<sup>th</sup> club meeting,

Chris provided this decription of his Go Kit:

Pelican 1520 case with rail kit to support the cutting board deck. I'm running the Icom IC-703+ HF/6 meter 10 watts or the Icom IC-706MKII HF/6/2 100 Watts depending on available power. Because they are the same size, they're interchangeable. For 2 meters and digital I'm using the Icom IC-2200H 65 watts. On the back of the Iid is a Dell Latitude ST tablet for logging or digital programs. The power section includes a Low Loss Power Gate in the blue case which switches from the power supply to the battery when the power goes out. It also float charges the battery when under power supply. Next is the Solar Panel Controller in the clear case which charges the battery from a solar panel and monitors the battery health using LED blinking codes. In the black case is the backup solar controller which includes a voltage and amp meter, 2 USB ports and 2 12 volt accessory ports. Next to the black controller is the 2 SO-239's for HF/6 and 2 meter and ground connection. I'm still in the process of adding some lighting and a speaker for the HF rig.




