- Mark KC1ACF updated everyone on the current Field Day plans:
 - Mark is investigating if some setup will be possible Friday evening (after 6pm)
 June 23rd. Folks interested in this at the meeting were Mike WA1MAD and
 Chris N1CFB. Mark to advise the club if this is possible.
 - Mark suggested an increased donation amount to the YMCA this year with a motion for a \$300 donation with a second by **John W1JGR**. Motion passed quorum vote.
 - Jim W1JT offered storage space for unused non-perishable food items.
 - Paul KB1MTW will assure the club BBQ grills are transported to the YMCA upper pavilion and each has a filled propane tank. Paul indicated he'll need help at the Pine St. clubhouse for equipment loading & transport. John WD1L volunteered to help. Any others, please contact Paul.











Old Business:

- Joe K1JMA apologized for being very busy lately and not as available for club activities as he would like.
- Joe K1JMA mentioned assembling a committee to investigate our possible club change to a 501(C)(3) entity and will be speaking with potential volunteers in the near future.
- Ross W1EKG and Paul KB1MTW summarized the recent Go-Kit Symposium activities on June 17th held at the United Methodist Church in Whitman. A general discussion took place regarding the event with suggestions for improving attendance and possibly adding vacuum tube radios. It was also noted a new club member joined at the symposium. **John W1JDG** made a motion to donate \$50 to the church, with a second by **Ross W1EKG**. Motion passed a guorum vote. Paul KB1MTW noted the church could be available for other events in the future and noted this could also include an outdoor event, using the clubs large pop-up tent.
- A general review of the ARRL Field Day event took place.
