

Secretary's Report:

President **Joe Amorelli K1JMA** called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm 01/03/18. A quorum was present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited, followed by a moment of silence for all recent silent keys. Following this an attendance roll call took place.

Treasurer **Jeff N1SOM** read the December 2017 treasurers report. Motion to accept the report as read made by **Jeff WK1D** with a second by **Ross W1EKG**. Motion passed auorum vote.

Secretary Larry W1VP indicated the December 2017 meeting notes were published online on the club website. Motion to accept the December 2017 meeting notes as published made by Ross W1EKG with a second by John WD1L. Motion passed quorum vote.

Health & Welfare report by Elayne KB1IKH.

Jim W1JT presented the report in Elayne's absence. Jim reports:

- A Thinking of You card was sent to **Joan Smith KB1NAX** (Ron's wife)
- A Sympathy card was sent to the family of recent silent key John Coombs WQ1L.

Paul KB1MTW commented further on John's condition while in rehab and noted the family is having a closed service at this time. Cards can be sent to Johns address as listed in the member roster.

New Members:

 Joe K1JMA and Jeff N1SOM presented a new member application in good standing to the club from Bob Mahoney KB1FBA. Motion to accept Bob as a new member made by John WD1L with a second by Jim W1JT. Motion passed quorum vote. Welcome to the club Bob!

New Business:

- Joe K1JMA noted the order of new club jackets will be finalized at this meeting.
 See Joe if you've not filled out an order form and would like a new club jacket.
- **Joe K1JMA** updated everyone on the recent decision by the 501(c)(3)/non-profit committee to move forward with adopting this status for the Whitman Amateur Radio Club. Joe noted several advantaged gained with a 501(c)(3) status:
 - Donations to the club are tax deductible (Paul KB1MTW noted an example would be families donating silent key equipment to our club would be issued paperwork allowing them to use the equipment value as a federal tax deduction. Joe K1JMA further noted examples where local businesses making donations to our club can also use these as tax deductions (examples: food at our events or supplies to repair the Quonset may be donated to us and used as deductions by those businesses donating to us.)
 - o Additional club insurance available at no charge.

The following must be done to move the 501(c)(3) process forward:

1. An application must be filed which requires a one-time \$250 fee. Further, **Jeff N1SOM** will now file yearly federal paperwork in addition to the yearly state paperwork he currently files. This is required to maintain the 501(c)(3) status.

- 2. Whitman club By-Laws must be amended for the following:
 - A dissolution clause must be added which details how the clubs assets are to be distributed to other 501(c)(3) organization(s) in the event the Whitman club ceases to exist. (note: this will be voted on at the February 2018 club meeting pending sufficient attendance of voting members)
 - Questions regarding future club membership levels were discussed briefly with Joe K1JMA agreeing to research this further.

Several more questions were asked which led to a short discussion. **Jeff N1SOM** confirmed filing yearly 501(c)(3) paperwork will not be a burden on him. **Jeff WK1D** asked if additional tracking of purchases, sales & donations for tax purposes must be tracked? **Jeff N1SOM** confirmed this is necessary.

- Joe K1JMA inform everyone that only 22 club members have paid their 2018 club dues (about 16% of the club membership). Joe and Jeff N1SOM will be sending out an email reminder to pay club dues asap. Paul KB1MTW noted without payment of dues, club members are no longer allowed to vote.
- **Ross W1EKG** provided a training update. On December 7th, 6 people passed their technician level VE exam. Congratulation to the new hams. Ross is planning a General training class January 9th.
- Ross W1EKG told us Mr. Mike will be attending the upcoming Winterfest Flea
 Market and will be selling tickets for the spring NEAR-Fest event. Also Ross is
 hearing of some changes in NEAR-Fest operations:
 - club entry will now be at 8AM rather than the typical 7AM making it easier for the commercial vendors to get setup starting at 7AM.
 - a member from each club is to remain after the event to help with cleanup activities. Ross noted more changes could be coming as well.
- Mike WA1MAD informed folks Mr. Mike sent an email indicating an NXDN HT w/Maine and NH frequencies was found at NEAR-Fest. It's at the NEAR-Fest lost and found office.
- Joe K1JMA noted the outreach program committee consisting of Alan KC1HLX and Tom WA1TOM had decided to hold on project development until after the holidays in January 2018. Now that it's January, Joe will try to help expand club member involvement. Paul KB1MTW mentioned a future opportunity for the outreach program. He was contacted by the East Bridgewater YMCA to provide a 1 day ham radio demonstration to their summer camp attendees along with the Boy Scouts. This would some weekend day in May 2018 (hopefully not NEAR-Fest or Dayton weekends!). This will be held in the field where we hold our Field Day operations. Paul will provide more details when available.
- Larry W1VP and Steve N1STV provided details on a potential plan for Whitman

club members to operate at the WingBusters flying field in Halifax during the Winter Field Day event 2pm Saturday January 27 – 2pm Sunday January 28th. Although not a Whitman club event, Steve will investigate field and shelter usage during this weekend for Whitman club members. With Wingbuster club approval and if off-road access is possible, a Whitman club email blast will be sent out advising of its availability.

- Joe K1JMA reminded folks of the For Sale section on the club website. The
 latest equipment list from Roy KB1CYV is posted there. Jeff N1ZZN asked if
 Roy is able to put up an antenna at his new QTH. Richard AG1B indicated this
 was not possible.
- Chris N1CFB kicked off a general discussion regarding the upcoming Winterfest event. Steve N1STV suggested use of an online payment system like Paypall for vendors to pay for tables in advance of the event. Everyone agreed this is a good idea and needs to be investigated.
- Joe K1JMA spoke in general about upcoming club events in 2018 and the need to increase club membership involvement.

Motion to adjourn the meeting made by **John WI1G** with a second by **Paul W1GTX**. Motion passed a quorum vote.

Joe K1JMA adjourned the meeting at 8:01pm, 01/03/18










