

#### Committee updates:

 Training Committee: Ross W1EKG reported the Technician class is completed. The VE session was completed as well and there are 3 new Hams. Congratulations and welcome to the hobby. Thank you to Ross W1EKG and Rich WA1RIW for running the Technician class

The basic Electronics class is going well. Thank you **Ted KC1JMZ** and **Ross W1EKG** for running this class.

**Ross W1EKG** reported that the General Class will start on Nov. 5<sup>th</sup>. This class will run on Tues. and Thursdays for 6 weeks and will conclude with the VE examination.

The next (MOTA) Meeting on the air net is scheduled for Wed Oct. 16<sup>th</sup> With the weekly 28.333mhz Rag Chew net to follow at 8:00PM. The Next MOTA meeting after this one is scheduled for Nov. 20<sup>th</sup> same times.

- Repeater Committee: No report but Status Quo
- Budget Committee: We asked for members to step up to the plate to be on the committee. Any future adjustments to the dues will be recommended by the Budget committee. Two additional members volunteered to joint the committee. They were Pat KA1UFO and Dave KB1QMX. The budget committee also includes Paul W1GTX and Scott W1MBH
- ByLaws Committee: No Report but we need a few folks to step up to the plate

### Old/New Business

• Chris N1CFB Called the group to order to vote to retain the dues at the current schedule which nullifies a previous vote to raise the dues. This vote required one month in advance notification to all club members. Members that could not attend could also send their vote in to the club president. The vote required a 2/3 majority of the quorum. The vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously 42 to 0 by a quorum vote. This included the votes from 6 members that could not make the meeting provided by the President of the club **Paul W1GTX**.

### <u>New Business</u>

Plimoth Plantation: Joe K1JMA asked the group for a count to see how many of the members would be able to help with the event setup and to be available on the Saturday and Sunday as well for operating shifts and take down. We will have a sign-up sheet as well. He also mentioned that only after the Club has committed to the event by having enough volunteers sign up i.e. a commitment by the club, that they wanted to continue this event, he would speak to the folks at the Plantation to confirm our dates there. The Plantation committee needs the clubs commitment no later than Friday October 18<sup>th</sup>!

**Joe K1JMA** mentioned at that the meeting, and it was confirmed by several club members, that participation of this event has dwindled over the past 4 years leading up to a requirement for 4-5 member having to remain at the plantation and work the event for 3 days without any relief, (that's 6-8+ hours straight). This left many members frustrated and angry that there was not enough commitment by the club to run the event in future years.

The club will only be conducting the event if the club has the required level of participation i.e. ALL slots are filled on the planned schedule. Only if we are committed i.e. people have scheduled and committed their time to the

event by the **deadline of Friday October 18**<sup>th</sup> will we proceed. We will not wait until November to see who will drop in.

If after October 18<sup>th</sup> the club has enough commitments to conduct the Plantation event, the schedule will be posted.

We will keep folks informed of the status. We will also need a check as well. The event is scheduled for Thanksgiving weekend. Setup is on Friday morning Nov. 29th. We will be operating Saturday the Nov. 30th and Sunday the Dec. 1st Jeff N1ZZN mentioned he would take care of contacting ARRL to have our event in QST. It looks like it will not be in the printed version until the Dec Edition. Hopefully we will be in the on-line listing in plenty of time.
